## East Side's Fit Programs

For the last six years the PTA has offered a wonderful Fit Program, developed by an East Side parent and personal trainer, just for fifth graders called Fit in Fifth. Two years ago, a team of fitness-minded parents including nutrition experts, yoga instructors, and personal trainers added a new curriculum for $3^{\text {rd }}$ graders called Fit in Third. This year, a new curriculum for $1^{\text {st }}$ graders, Fit in First, has been added. The PTA's goal is to add similar programs for all grades eventually. These programs run in a similar way to Adventures in Art, where a parent volunteer comes into the classroom to teach once per month for 5 or 6 months during the school year, except this time the subject is nutrition and fitness. The curriculum is spelled out in binders that include all the information and handouts needed to teach the class, and any special supplies needed are held in a central location.

## Environmental Education Committee Update

The Environmental Education Committee has a lot going on at East Side! Environmental awareness starts at home and is continued at school through enriching programs involving the kids and their parents. These are great ways to enforce what we're teaching our kids about being responsible consumers and stewards of the Earth.

Here is a recap of the fantastic programs happening at East Side:

Recycle Fridays:
Every Friday morning the kids bring their class' paper, cardboard, and plastic recycling to the cafeteria where parent volunteers greet them and empty their bins. The first week of school we had 6 huge garbage bags of paper and cardboard recyclables. The second week we had 8.
The third week we had 9 ! In addition to keeping all these products out of the landfills, our school earns money back - the more we recycle the more money we get!

Ink and toner cartridge recycling:
East Side earns credit at Staples for all these recyclables.
Sneaker and race shirt recycling:
These items go to help less advantaged families.
Capri-Sun pouch recycling:
Collect yours at home and bring them in so they can be turned in to fun products-perfect repurposing!

So start your collections at home and send them to school! They are all collected in bins outside the media center.

The Environmental Education Committee also works to keep the grounds in front of the school looking tidy and pretty. And in case you didn't know, our kids have a wonderful spot for outdoor lessons, reading time, and a daily dose of nature-the DEAR Garden (stands for Drop Everything And Read!). Our committee keeps the DEAR Garden cleaned up and pruned for everyone's enjoyment. (More information can be found in upcoming e-news or by emailing Cristin - see below)

Volunteers are needed to enforce our environmental missions at East Side. The commitment is small and the timing is usually flexible. Please consider sharing a bit of your time and energy, and involving your kids in giving back to the East Side community.
