**Baptisms:** We generally baptize at 2:00 p.m. on the 1st, 2nd and 3rd Sundays of most months. If you would like to arrange your baby's Baptism please call the Parish Office. A baptism prep class is required. Baptism prep classes are held on the first Thursday of every month at 7:00 p.m. You must call the Parish Office to register for the class

**Please Note: We do not baptize during Lent.**

**Marriage:** Couples should make arrangements and start Marriage Prep with the Parish Office at least one year in advance of the planned wedding date and **before** finalizing any social plans. Couples must be registered at least six months before booking their wedding.

**Anointing of the Sick:** *No Longer Last Rites! If you are suffering from a terminal illness, have a chronic illness or will be having surgery soon you can receive the Anointing of the Sick.* There is no reason to wait until near death, please call 732-370-0500 ext. 3.

**First Communion and Confirmation:** Please call Religious Education at 732-370-1515 ext. 311.

Dear Parish Family,

Christus Resurrexi! Resurrexi Vere! Christos Voskrese! Voistinnu Voskkrese!, Christ is Risen!  
Truly he is Risen!! With these most solemn and traditional greetings for Easter Day, I greet all of you who have come to the Paschal Feast of Joy! Happy Easter!

For those of you who may not have heard, our parish along with the 107 parishes of the Diocese of Trenton and all its institutions, are undergoing a one year study and evaluation process known as "Faith In Our Future". Each parish has a "Core Team" made up of the Pastor, Trustee and 3 lay volunteers. Each parish has implemented a study instrument. Our parish used a survey instrument available in paper or online and we received 1,300 responses, which took two days and 75 Volunteers to collate the results. This survey is the basis for our self-evaluation. Every parish has dialog partners for the process called "Cohort Partners". Our Cohort is composed of St. Monica in Jackson, St. Elizabeth in Manchester, St. John in Lakehurst. Both our Core Team and our Cohort partners attend a full day of training. At the beginning of the process our Core Team met weekly for 3 hours every Monday night to do the work of the FIOF process.

This FIOF process was implemented by Bishop David O'Connell principally to manage the loss of Catholics due to migration to the South and South West of our Country, aging infrastructure in the Diocese, surplus infrastructure that is no longer necessary and the increasing shortage of priests to manage 107 parishes (comprised of some 123 worship sites). We know that in the next decade we will only have 97 priests to staff 107 parishes (123 churches). New models must be explored and implemented to face our future successfully. As the Bishop has stated, change is inevitable and it will come whether we welcome it or not, whether we plan and prepare for it or not. It will come and we must be ready to meet the challenges we will face together as faith communities in the four counties of our Diocese; Monmouth, Ocean, Burlington and Mercer.

For those following the process (which is available online at [www.dioceseoftrenton.org](http://www.dioceseoftrenton.org)), it is totally transparent. On Tuesday March 15, our Core Team attended the Cohort Training at St. Luke's in Toms River. After the training we meet our cohort partners and exchanged each parishes data verification form along with summaries of the surveys, Strengths of the parish and list of challenges of the parish. Each Core Team spoke about the process and we set our next meeting as a Cohort to go deeper into the data that was exchanged. The Parish Core Team will also meet before the next Cohort Meeting to review the exchanged data to make meaningful contributions for the next Cohort Meeting. The principal charge of the Cohort Teams is to present a recommendation by June 2016 to the Diocesan Core Team regarding how parishes might explore alternative models in parish leadership for the future. Presented were six (6) models permitted by the Code of Canon Law: Collaborative Parishes, Linked Parishes, Merged Parishes, In Solidum Teams, Parish Life Director and Personal Parishes. More to come so stay tuned!

The Resurrection of Jesus was an earth shattering reality for the First Century, it CHANGED and CHALLENGED the well-established Secular and Religious Order. It was a change and challenge that spread rapidly around the globe, forever altering human history. As Catholics, we believe the Death and Resurrection of Jesus is an ongoing event of human history, the Risen Lord lives in His Church, His Word, His Priests, His People. He continually calls us to conversion (a change of the Soul) and He continues to challenge us to grow. We then continue to be challenged and changed by the presence of the Risen Lord who mightily assured us He would remain to the end of the ages and gave us His Holy Spirit, who breathes ever new life into the Church, Her parishes and Her people. The Holy Spirit, as Pope Francis reminds us, is always surprising us! Please pray for the success of the Faith In Our Future Process, for our Bishop who will implement our suggestions, our FIOF Core Team to be guided by the Holy Spirit for the good of all, our Cohort Partners and the Diocesan Core Team. Change is often viewed with trepidation but it comes. Nothing can stop change, it is a constant in our lives. In truth most changes are not detrimental, most often change is full of wonderful surprises, opportunities and moments of growth. May we be ever-aware of the presence of the Risen Lord, His Promise to be with us and to heed the movement of the breath of the Holy Spirit which ever renews, strengthens and invigorates the Church!

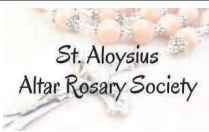

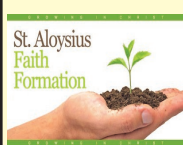

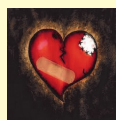

The screening process is very thorough and money is never given directly to the caller. As representatives of St. Aloysius Church, it is a privilege to visit with residents of Jackson who have suffered serious illness, loss of employment and other types of adversity, offering them hope.

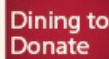

## **Jubilee Year of Mercy** *Diocese of Trenton*

Bishop O'Connell has designated Saint Aloysius Church a Shrine Church (a place of pilgrimage) among the churches in the Diocese of Trenton. For a full listing of other Shrine Churches in the Diocese, please visit [www.dioceseoftrenton.org/yearofmercy](http://www.dioceseoftrenton.org/yearofmercy). The Holy

Doors throughout the Diocese were opened Dec. 13, 2015 and will remain open through Nov. 20, 2016.

Visiting these sites and following the conditions below offers the chance to receive a plenary indulgence.

All Catholics of the Diocese of Trenton who visit one of these churches and its Holy Door of Mercy on pilgrimage and who fulfill the conditions ordinarily attached to an indulgence (remission of temporal punishment for sins already forgiven, see canon 992) shall, with the proper intention and disposition, receive the plenary Jubilee Indulgence available during the Extraordinary Jubilee of Mercy. Those conditions are:

1. recipient must be a baptized Catholic in the state of grace (free from mortal sin) at time of indulgenced work (pilgrimage);
2. recipient must internally express a detachment from and rejection of sin at time of indulgenced work (pilgrimage);
3. recipient must make a sacramental confession within 20 days of indulgenced work (pilgrimage), preferably but not required on the day itself;
4. recipient must receive Holy Communion within 20 days of indulgenced work (pilgrimage), preferably but not required on the day itself;
5. recipient must pray for the intention of the Holy Father at the time of the indulgenced work (pilgrimage), usually the "Profession of Faith (from Mass)," one "Our Father," one "Hail Mary" and one "Glory be to the Father" or other suitable prayers. *The Jubilee Plenary Indulgence may be obtained for the living or the dead and will be available only one time daily. Parish pilgrimages to churches with the Holy Door of Mercy can be arranged in consultation with the pastors of the parishes concerned.*

St Aloysius Healthcare Ministry offers help and information for parishioners on topics that occur in everyday life. **March is National Colorectal Cancer Awareness Month.**

Colorectal cancer is cancer of the colon or rectum. Each year, more than 136,000 people are diagnosed with colorectal cancer and more than 50,000 die of the disease. With certain types of screening, this cancer can be prevented by removing polyps (grape like growths on the wall of the intestine) before they become cancerous. Several screening tests detect colorectal cancer

early, when it can be easily and successfully treated.

**Risk Factors: You might be at an increased risk for colorectal cancer if you:**

- Are age 50 or older
- Smoke or use tobacco
- Are overweight or obese, especially if you carry fat around your waist
- Are not physically active
- Drink alcohol in excess (especially if you are a man)
- Eat a lot of red meat, such as beef, pork or lamb, or a lot of processed meat, such as bacon, sausage, hot dogs or cold cuts
- Have a personal or family history of colorectal cancer or benign (not cancerous) colorectal polyps
- Have a personal or family history of inflammatory bowel disease, such as ulcerative colitis or Crohn's disease

**Early stages of colorectal cancer don't usually have symptoms. (That is why screening is so important!) Later on, people may have these symptoms:**

- Bleeding from the rectum or blood in or on the stool
- Change in bowel habits
- Stools that are more narrow than usual
- General problems in the abdomen, such as bloating, fullness or cramps
- Diarrhea, constipation or a feeling in the rectum that the bowel movement isn't quite complete
- Weight loss for no apparent reason
- Being tired all the time
- Vomiting

Colorectal Cancer is cancer of the colon and rectum. It is the third most frequently diagnosed cancer in both men and women and the second leading cause of cancer deaths in the United States.

#### **Prevention**

- Be physically active for at least 30 minutes at least five days a week
- Maintain a healthy weight and waist size (!)
- Don't smoke. If you do smoke, quit(!!)
- Limit alcohol to no more than one drink per day if you're a woman or two drinks per day if you're a man
- Eat more fruits, vegetables and whole grains, which are good sources of fiber
- Eat less red meat and cut out processed meat
- Get screened according to guidelines

#### **Early Detection**

Begin getting screened at age 50. If you are older than age 75, ask your doctor if you should continue to be screened. If you are a high risk, talk to your health care professional about screening earlier and more often. Talk to your doctor about your screening test options

##### **Tests that find pre-cancer and cancer:**

Colonoscopy – Every 10 years (or as your health professional advises)

Virtual colonoscopy – Every 5 years

Flexible sigmoidoscopy – Every 5 years

##### **Tests that mainly detect cancer:**

Stool occult blood test (FOBT) (guaiac) – Every year

Stool immunochemical test (FIT) – Every year

Stool DNA test (sDNA) – ask your health care professional. (The FDA approved the use of the sDNA test in 2014.)

An abnormal result of a virtual colonoscopy or a double-contrast barium enema, or a positive FOBT, FIT or sDNA test, should be followed up with a colonoscopy.
