Elevator Demolition Completed

The demolition work on the elevator is over, this week the 12" foundation for the elevator was poured and the block walls for the hoist-way were laid. The exterior of the hoist-way will be water proofed with water stop joints. Once the block walls are completed the area will be backfilled and Moser Construction will begin building the elevator control room in the basement of the church.

The base of the church has been completed using a

"smooth stick-joint" tuck-pointing technique. The caulking around the stain glass windows has been removed



and new caulking has been applied. A special tuck-pointing tool was designed to apply a "grapevine joint" that will give the mortar a vine like appearance in the middle of the mortar.

Among the hundreds of volunteers at St. Rose, one of the lesser known committees may be your Finance Committee. Meeting on a regular basis, they provide oversight and advice for the Pastor in all areas of parish finance.

The committee is made up of individuals with varying financial backgrounds - ranging from CPA to corporate staff mangers, a retired Chief Fiscal Officer, financial planner and company owners. While their positions may vary, their fiduciary interests are extensive. They monitor each area of parish fiscal operations including the cemetery, school, endowment fund and special programs. Each month one or two members review the details that go into the parish balance sheet and operating statements. Members receive the routine reports as well as reviewing the budget statements in detail. We take our volunteer duties very seriously.

In addition, members attend annual Diocesan training sessions so that they have a working knowledge of the requirements and laws that apply to the management of parish funds. Every effort is made to be certain we have the internal controls and checks and balances necessary to assure security and responsibility for a parish of our size and complexity. 
