

What is BeHIP? The Be Healthy Inclusive Program (BeHIP) is a program operated by The Arc of Lincoln, through a grant awarded by the Community Health Endowment of Lincoln. The purpose of the program is to provide opportunities for inclusive recreation for youth and adults with disabilities.

What is inclusive recreation? This refers to the practice of people with and without disabilities participating in fitness and recreation activities TOGETHER. Inclusive recreation services provide the support and accommodations needed to give the person with a disability the opportunity to participate in activities of their choice.

Who is eligible for BeHIP? Youth with disabilities under age 21 are eligible. Adults over age 21 must be eligible for Developmental Disabilities (DD) services through the Nebraska Department of Health and Human Services.

Is there a fee for the service? There is no fee for services for youth. Adults must include BeHIP as a part of their budget for DD non-specialized services. For all ages, the participant is responsible for the cost of classes or activity fees.

Who provides the inclusive recreation support? The Arc recruits, completes background checks, and trains people to serve as Recreation Advocates. Care is taken to ensure that the Recreation Advocate is a good match for the participant and for the selected activities.

Programs Offered:

Friendship Club:

This is a program designed to provide recreational activities for middle school and high school age kids to get involved with on Friday nights! The goal is to have fun, make friends, and provide social opportunities. Activities will include things such as bowling, swimming, movie nights, etc.

The goal of Recreational Therapy is to work on social, emotional, and physical goals through play and activities. By providing fun social activities and volunteer staff, Wonderfully made hopes to give children a place to be a kid as well as learn about themselves and gain confidence in who they are.

Rec Therapy goals:

-inclusion -social skills

-community integration -friendship skills

-communication skills -team building

Individualized Recreational Therapy:

Private services with a Rec Therapist are available and are very individualized. The overall goal is to improve functioning and help them to be as healthy, active, and independent as possible in their individual life pursuits. These services follow a standardized

Focus Groups:

Focus groups are made up of 3-4 kids with similar social skill needs. These groups are structured and have specific social skill goals for each of the kids in the group. A CTRS places kids in these groups based on assessment and treatment goals in which the child could benefit form a group therapy setting.

THE DD WAIVER

The DD Waiver is a voluntary waiver. It is not a federally mandated program. Therefore, the Nebraska State legislature determines how to fund the waiver. One of the determining criteria for funding is the number of persons on the DD waiver waiting list. People on the wait list have already met eligibility guidelines and are waiting for services. Eligibility for the DD waiver is not dependent on your family's income.

On behalf of Autism Family Network, I encourage you to apply for the DD waiver. The legislature needs to be aware of the number of people with developmental delays in our state in order to fund the waiver appropriately. There will be a few years of waiting once your name is placed on the list. Don't let this discourage you. Your loved one will have to wait a few years for services regardless if you sign up today or in 5 years from now. Get your loved one's name on the list immediately to decrease the number of years he/she has to wait for services. Some services provided under the waiver include respite, daycare, rehabilitative care, and chore services.
