Be sure to list all steps, including those that do not repeat.</p>	<p>Identify potential and existing hazards from each step. Consider the whole environment and not just the tasks in the step. You may list a potential accident or injury in parentheses and then work backward to ID the hazard.</p>	<p>Using the first two columns, list actions to eliminate or minimize the hazards. Don't say "be careful" – provide specific recommendations: engineer hazard out, list required or recommended PPE, provide training, good housekeeping, ergonomics – straight wrists, etc. List recommended operating procedures. Correct serious hazards immediately, and write the new condition on the JSA form.</p>
