AMAZING ASSEMBLY IN MAY

The Signature Project, a multi-faceted digital tapestry, is coming to Clinton **Thursday, May 14**, for performances at 1 and 2 pm. Its core is a huge 76x36-foot mural layered with hidden secrets. One layer is composed entirely of individual signatures, while other layers are revealed by using x-rays, magnetic fields, or ultraviolet lights. A unique, exhilarating tapestry blending art and technology, the live performance of *The Signature Project* also offers the opportunity for audience members to join over 300,000 people whose signatures already comprise the fabric of this monumental art work. THE CLINTON GREEN

Did you know that you could lower your amount of garbage by up to 24 percent by simply starting a compost pile in your backyard? This means saving yourself money if you live in Maplewood, where we can opt for the one-can (instead of two-can) garbage pickup service.

Compost is organic material made from yard trimmings and food residuals that you build in your backyard. You can buy compost bins of all kinds, from the very high end Mantis Compost-Twin, at a whopping \$500, to the very low end types of recycled plastic composters, at about \$80 each. Or, you can make an outdoor bin area yourself with some 2x4's and chicken wire; see how on www.bluegrassgardens.com. Skeptical? Here is some myth-busting about composting:

1. **It smells.** No, once the new food scraps are turned under, the pile smells like good clean earth.
2. **It's hard to make.** No, you can do absolutely nothing with your pile, and it will still turn to compost eventually.
3. **It takes time.** Yes, it does, but not *your* time! You can let it sit and stew; it will wait for you.
4. **It attracts vermin.** No, unless you already have a large colony of vermin, in which case, it's better to find out now rather than later.

What to put in? Any food scraps (vegetables, fruits, eggshells, coffee) but no animal fats (meat, fish, dairy) and any yard trimmings with no diseases, insects, weed seeds, or pesticides.

One easy guideline is to make layers of "green" and "brown" things to speed up the breakdown process. "Green" things are high in nitrogen (food scraps, grass clippings, plant trimmings); "brown" things are high in carbon (leaves, paper, hay, paper towel rolls). Another guideline is to turn over your pile with a pitchfork (or spin it in a barrel) about once a week so that, again, the pile will break down faster.

Once the compost is "cooked," it then becomes *humus*, or new soil. Many gardeners call it "black gold" because it is like heavenly manna for plants. Spread it underneath trees and shrubs in early spring, and sift it onto lawns during your fall seeding. It works wonders! —*Clare Payton*

This summer, the district plans to make bathroom steam cleaning, painting, and overall maintenance a project for the whole district.

However, no amount of work on our part can eliminate this problem completely if students continue to abuse school property when they use our school bathrooms. Please remind your students to treat school bathrooms as neatly as they would at home. Also, remind your older students that their behavior serves as a guide for younger students who see them at school every day.

Cafeteria Some of our children are so excited to see their friends from other classes at lunch that they are forgetting to eat their lunch and have to rush through at the end of lunch in order to finish their food. Please remind your students to eat first, then join their friends to catch up!

Indoor Recess Spring showers brought us May flowers and lots of indoor recess days. Remember that we try to rotate students through the auditorium, the gym when possible, and games in the classroom. We are always happy to see parents who can help out at recess to give children a chance to stretch and run a little.
