LEARNING & PERFORMANCE OBJECTIVES

This course is designed for obstetricians and gynecologists, primary care physicians and other health care providers for women. The intended result of this activity is improvements in knowledge, performance and patient outcomes. After completion of this seminar the participant should be able to:

- Explain current approaches to intrauterine scarring, fertility sparing surgery and genetics for the gynecologist.
