

Application Instructions for Northwest's English as a Second Language Program

- 1. Answer all the questions on the *English as a Second Language Program Application* on the next page (<u>please type or write</u> <u>clearly in black ink</u>). There is no application fee for the ESL Program but there is a \$50 fee if you intend to apply for a degree program at Northwest.
- 2. Fill out the *Certificate of Financial Support*. This form verifies that your sponsor (parent, relative, or friend) will pay for your expenses while you study in the United States at Northwest Missouri State University.
- 3. Ask your sponsor to provide an official bank statement or government affidavit of support. It must show enough money to pay for 12 months of study (U.S. \$22,400). You must send the *original* document, not a copy.
- Send all of these documents (steps 1, 2, and 3) and a copy of your passport to: International Admissions AD 245 800 University Drive Maryville MO 64468-6001 U. S. A.

How do I get a visa?

When we get your application, we will review the application and determine if you are admissible. If you are, we will send you a SEVIS Form I-20 and ESL acceptance letter. (Acceptance to the ESL Program is not the same as regular acceptance to Northwest Missouri State University. See below for details about applying for tentative acceptance.

You should follow the instructions to get a nonimmigrant student (F-1) visa on the website of the US Embassy/Consulate in your country. We will also send a packet to you when you get accepted that explains how to get a visa.

What is tentative (conditional) acceptance?

If you apply for acceptance to a degree (bachelor's or master's) program at Northwest and meet all the academic and financial requirements, but do not have a TOEFL score or your TOEFL score is too low then you will be issued <u>tentative acceptance</u> (as of June 2012 the minimum score is 500 PBT/61 iBT/5.5 IELTS for Bachelors, or 550 PBT/79 iBT/6.5 IELTS for Masters). **Masters students MUST submit GRE/GMAT scores to get tentative acceptance.** If you get tentative acceptance, you will receive a letter from Northwest Missouri State University admissions office telling you that you may study in the university after you score 500/550 on our paper-based institutional TOEFL. PLEASE NOTE: our institutional TOEFL cannot be for admission at other universities. You will also receive an ESL acceptance letter. Tentative acceptance allows you to get an I-20 to use for your visa, but you will be required to take the English as a Second Language intensive English program and successfully complete the classes for each session until you score the minimum required for admission to the desired degree.

As a tentatively accepted student, you must attend the ESL program to improve your English. Upon successful completion of classes, you will take the institutional TOEFL given at Northwest to attempt to achieve the minimum required TOEFL score (500/550 PBT) to study as a bachelor's student at Northwest. Students submitting TOEFL and IELTS scores after they have been tentatively accepted but before they arrive must arrive during undergraduate intake periods of August or January. A deferral fee will be charged to send a new I-20 to you. It is not possible to be a part time ESL student and take degree level classes part time.

How do I apply as a "tentative acceptance" student to Northwest Missouri State University?

If your TOEFL/IELTS score is too low or you did not take the test and you want to study at Northwest Missouri State University after you finish in the ESL Program, you should do steps 1, 2, 3, and 4 at the top of this page and also these steps:

- 5. Complete the *International Student Application*. Go to <u>http://www.nwmissouri.edu/admissions/intl/application.htm</u> to apply on-line.
- 6. Ask your high school for transcripts. (Transcripts are papers that show your grades or marks.)
- 7. Ask your high school for a paper that says that you have finished high school.
- 8. If these papers are in your language, they must be translated into English.
- 9. If you went to a college or university, you must get the same papers (as in steps 6, 7, and 8) from that school.
