New York State Common Core Learning Standards

WHAT ARE THE COMMON CORE LEARNING STANDARDS?

Learning standards describe what students should know and be able to do in each grade. New York and more than 40 other states across the country have transitioned to a new set of learning standards called the Common Core. These new standards provide a clear picture of what students need to learn each year in order to graduate from high school ready to succeed in college and careers.

The Common Core standards were developed by educators and other experts based on research and lessons learned from top-performing countries. The standards describe the skills and knowledge our students need to succeed in a rapidly changing world, including the ability to think creatively, solve real-world problems, make effective arguments, and engage in debates.

In New York State, the Common Core includes standards for students in pre-kindergarten through grade twelve in English language arts and math. The English standards include a focus on literacy in history, science, and technical subjects—emphasizing that teachers in all subjects are responsible for teaching literacy. As schools implement these new standards, students will be asked to do significantly more writing and to read increasingly complex texts, with an emphasis on nonfiction. In math, students will take more time to understand concepts deeply, make connections between topics, and master complex ideas through hands-on learning.

Second Grade Reading



- In second grade, we will be using the New York State Common Core Modules for Listening and Learning, along with adapting the Lucy Calkins' Reader's Workshop format for independent reading. We will also use trade books and our Scott-Foresman Reading Street materials during reading instruction.
- We use large group shared reading instruction and small guided reading groups to utilize the modules, reading series and will also supplement with trade books (nonfiction and chapter books) throughout the year.
- We are focusing on learning to read and learning to understand and think about our reading.
- By the end of the school year, students need to read to learn for third grade! Most students will also be reading chapter books by the end of this year, if they are not already doing so.



Second Grade Word Work



- A new unit of words is assigned weekly based on our New York State common core learning standards.
- The students will do word sorts to help them understand the spelling rule.
- Children will spend the whole week using the words in varied assignments and centers.
- Students will be assessed on how they apply new words in their daily writing.



Second Grade Writing



- In second grade, we will meet the New York State Common Core Learning Standards (CCLS) by using the writing program, "Units of Primary Writing", based on the research of well known author and researcher, Lucy Calkins.
- Second graders will engage in demand and creative writing.
- Second graders will learn many different types of writing (personal narrative, non-fiction (expository), persuasive, how-to, sequence, friendly letter, journal entry, etc.).
- Second graders will learn how to write complete sentences using correct capitalization, punctuation and spelling.
- Second graders will be encouraged to read over their work to revise and edit their writing, as needed.
- By the end of the year, second graders should be able to write a complete paragraph with an indented topic sentence, details and a conclusion.
- Second graders will complete demand writing pieces in response to our reading and based on our Common Core Learning Standards. Writing may be graded using a scoring rubric. The students will be introduced to all of these new concepts!

Second Grade Science and Social Studies Curriculum



In second grade, our science and social studies curriculum is embedded in our New York State Listening and Learning ELA Modules. We will also use Scholastic News and New York State Social Studies Weekly to enhance our instruction. We will be studying the following topics:

- * States of Matter
- * Plant and Animal Life Cycles
- * Healthy Me
- * Biographies
- * Cycles of Nature
- * Rural/Urban/Suburban Communities
- * Map Skills and Landforms
- * Economics
- * Government and Citizenship

Handwriting

Second grade students will review the lowercase and uppercase manuscript alphabet. Students will be expected to form letters properly and write neatly and legibly on all assignments. We are preparing for learning cursive in third grade!



Second Grade Report Cards

- Second graders will receive report cards that will be printed from a computerized program THREE times a year (trimesters).
- The second grade report card will be based on the New York State Common Core Learning Standards.
- · Overall subject grades will be given in second grade.
- Each individual standard that is taught during a particular trimester will be assessed with the following scale:
 - 4 Exceeding Proficiency
 - 3 Meets Proficiency
 - 2 Developing Proficiency
 - 1 Needs Improvement
- If a standard is left blank, it was not assessed during that trimester.
- Parent-Student-Teacher Conferences will be held in November.
 Other conferences can be scheduled at any time during year, if needed.



Classroom Management



- Boys and girls in Room 204 develop a social contract within the first week of school. We always remember the "golden rule": Treat others as you would like to be treated. Students need to respect everyone!
- I believe in being firm, fair, consistent, but always caring when it comes to discipline.
- We use the "Capturing Kids' Hearts" model for discipline.
 First, a student who is not making a good choice gets a
 reminder. Second, I discuss the problem with the student
 using four focus questions. If needed, the student writes
 a note home to parents that needs to be signed and
 returned the next day and/or calls home.
- Students enjoy EARNING their privileges! Our classroom is POSITIVE!



- Please send in an emergency box of individually wrapped snacks (i.e. granola bars, fruit snacks, etc.) to be kept in your child's locker...just in case!










Second Grade Homework

- Homework is given on a nightly basis during the week.
 Over the weekend, nightly reading is a must.
- Homework will come home in an agenda that all students will carry back and forth from home every day.
- Students should complete homework independently. However, after the work is completed, parents should give guidance and should correct the homework to allow the student to make corrections immediately.
- Homework is not graded, but if it is not completed, students lose privileges (free time).





Second Grade Agenda

- The ONLY way to become a BETTER READER is to READ!








