We are excited to announce that this fall, we will host our third **annual Barbara DeNitto Memorial Horse Show**. This show is open to the following Challenge Unlimited riders:

1. Must be registered to ride in the Early Fall Block 2014 (Sept. 2 to Oct. 25, 2014) and have ridden in one other block this year (winter, early spring, spring or summer);
2. Must be enrolled in our Challenge Unlimited therapeutic riding program (for riders with a disability or diagnosis);
3. Must be at least 7 years old as of Sept. 28, 2014; and
4. Must complete a registration form and return it to Ironstone Farm no later than Sept. 6 along with a \$20 registration fee per rider.

**NOTE:** *The registration form will be available in July. If there is more than one eligible rider in your family, please complete a separate registration form for each rider. Registration is limited to 40 riders.*

**Register for Lessons**

Each year, lessons are offered in six blocks of eight or nine weeks: Winter, Early Spring, Spring, Summer, Early Fall and Fall (see Lesson Block Calendar). After the Evaluation, the office will call the client to set up a time that will be his/her regular weekly appointment for the lesson block. For each block of lessons thereafter, registration and payment are required prior to the beginning of the next block. Ironstone Farm's lessons fill up quickly. With over 500 riders to schedule it is necessary that registrations arrive by the due date. All registrations must be returned by their due date. Late registrations will be assessed a \$25 surcharge.

**Pre-cancels**

The rider is offered the chance to select two dates for pre-cancels during the lesson block and makeup lessons will be offered for only those dates that were pre-canceled during the same lesson block. Ironstone Farm is unable to schedule make-ups for lessons otherwise missed. Each individual enrolling in the Challenge Unlimited programs must provide the office with a registration form (available on-line or in the Ironstone Farm Welcome Center). Any individual with a diagnosis must provide a completed physician's approval form.

**Please call if you are not going to be able to attend your scheduled lesson.**

**Riding and Horsemanship**

Riders are asked to arrive 15 minutes prior to the start of the lesson and to check in at the Welcome Center. The Welcome Center Receptionist will direct the rider to the location of the lesson and let the rider know which horse he or she will be riding. Any of the lessons may include unmounted activities such as learning to tack up, grooming and cooling out the horse and putting tack and lesson-related equipment away.

**Importance of Proper Clothing**

An equestrian helmet (ASTM/SEI approved), long pants, and shoes or boots with a firm, square heel are required for all riders in saddles.

Basic Training: Vaulting: A helmet (ASTM/SEI approved), loose fitting or stretch attire (such as sweats or leggings) and sneakers. Sneakers are only appropriate for Basic Training: Vaulting or riders who are led in our in-hand lessons. Riders in saddles should ride a boot or shoe with a small flat heel. Please check with the Challenge Unlimited Program Director for your appropriate footwear.

Ensuring safety is a top priority. Riders will not be allowed on the horse unless properly dressed.
