"The Introduction of the Third Edition of the Roman Missal"

On Sunday, November 27th, the First Sunday of Advent, the Third Edition of the Roman Missal will begin to be used as the new translation of the Roman Missal prayed at the celebration of Mass. Many of us have been anticipating its introduction. "Actually, the "new" Roman Missal isn't really "new." It is the third edition/revision of the Roman Missal, which was first issued in 1969 following the Second Vatican Council." (Fr. A. Kadavil)

After the Second Vatican Council, when the Roman Missal was being translated into various languages in the Church, the English speaking countries were given permission to translate the prayers of the Mass in a more informal language, that is, not exact translations of the original Latin texts but their meaning.

In this Third Edition of the Roman Missal the English words are now a closer translation of the Latin text. As members of the Catholic Church we will now pray in unison with Catholics throughout the world using a translation that shares a similar rendering of the Latin text. The original Latin texts contain beautiful imagery, poetic language and allusions to Scripture, which are now contained in the new Missal. This new translation uses more formal language.

The Mass is not changing. It is the same Mass that you and I have been celebrating for the past forty years. What is changing is the wording of some of the prayers that you and I will be saying. To assist us in this transition we will have pew cards containing the words of the Mass parts and prayers. You will notice that most of the wording of these prayers will be the same as usual. Different words or phrases will be contained within these "new" prayers. After a few weeks of praying these prayers it will seem like we have been saying them all along.

It is my hope that the introduction of the Third Edition of the Roman Missal will also be an opportunity for spiritual renewal in our parish and our Diocese. This new translation has the power to deepen our prayer and to foster our ongoing conversion.

This is an exciting time for us. We will be joining with English-speaking Catholics throughout the world in introducing the Third Edition of the Roman Missal on November 27th.

THANKSGIVING FOOD BAGS

To The Wonderful Parishioners of St. James:

It is hard to believe that Thanksgiving will be upon us in such a short time. I am so grateful to you for all of your food donations during the year. The fact that you have made life a little easier for your neighbors in need is truly remarkable. We are trying something different for Thanksgiving this year. I am asking those of you who are able to do so to donate a "Thanksgiving Food Bag" **OR** a \$10 gift card to a local supermarket.

To Donate a Thanksgiving Food Bag:

Take one reusable (cloth) food bag and add to it some items to make a nice meal for a client. For example, I created a bag that contained a box of instant potatoes, a box of stuffing, a couple of cans of vegetables, a can of cranberry sauce, a jar of gravy, a box of corn muffin mix, a can of coffee, a package of cookies, and a can of mixed fruits. The total cost of the items was slightly more than \$10. (Coffee is expensive, but it is a welcome treat to a person in need.) You may choose **any** items you think will create a nice meal. The reason for the "reusable" food bag is that many clients walk/bike to our pantry. It makes it easier to carry items in a reusable bag (and it's also environmentally friendly).

To Donate a Gift Card:

Purchase a \$10 gift card at a local supermarket and put it in an envelope marked "OUTREACH". These can be dropped off to our office or placed in the collection basket. The reason for the gift cards is that many of our clients are <u>singles</u>, <u>senior citizens</u>, <u>and small families</u> who do not have appropriate cooking facilities for a large turkey. Many of our clients cook their meals using <u>only</u> a microwave oven.

The Boy Scouts will be collecting the Thanksgiving Food Bags after masses the weekend of November 12th and 13th. Gift cards can be placed in the collection baskets that weekend also. The Outreach Office is open Monday through Thursday between 10am and 2pm for drop offs. It is advisable for all donations to reach our office at least one week before Thanksgiving.






