The Education Age this Wednesday published a response from me that supported the Minister but suggested that this was just the start of the debate about senior schooling. LEADERSHIP AND MANAGEMENT CHANGES

I am pleased to announce that Aine Maher has been appointed Executive Director, Learning and Curriculum. This position will focus on innovation in curriculum, learning and assessment standards, and the continuity of curriculum outcomes across the College. She will be the College leader on the Board's Education Policy Committee and co-chair the College Reference Committee. Greg King's position as Vice Principal and Executive Director has now incorporated Human Resources and Teaching. Both will work closely on the relationship between high quality teaching, student learning and curriculum, will jointly manage developments in the Middle Years and will collaborate with the other members of Executive in the educational and operational management of the College. A profile of both Aine and Greg can be found on the intranet under Principal.

While all mentors and Student Services staff, under the wonderful leadership of Marg McCormack, have a strong, specific responsibility for student advocacy, I have asked Lisa McKay-Brown, PeaceBuilders® Coordinator, to formally be Student Advocate in situations in which students need support in challenging a College decision about behaviour consequences. This will ensure that students and their parents are well informed and the student is able to articulate his or her response to the College as part of the natural justice process of appealing.

Victorian Schools State Cricket Competition

Last Friday, 14 Year 9 and 10 Students ventured to Croydon to compete in the Victorian Secondary Schools State Cricket Competition (super 8's) – Regional Carnival.

The day provided the boys with an opportunity to experience the game of cricket in a modified format with many different rule changes and challenges of which they would not normally come across.

In the boys section the format saw 8 competing schools split in to 2 groups, all playing 3 preliminary rounds with the highest ranked winners in each pool progressing to a Grand Final.

As a combined group who had never played cricket with each other before, in typical Eltham fashion the boys attacked each match with a great deal of enthusiasm and determination.

At the completion of the preliminary rounds we had been successful in all 3 of our games and led Pool A. We then progressed to the Grand Final against the top ranked school from Pool B, again coming away with a convincing victory.

We will now be invited to compete in the Regional State Finals to be held in Term 4 with a further opportunity to play on the MCG in December should we again be successful at the State Finals.

May I congratulate the following students, who approached the day not only in terms of competing at a very high level, but with a level of maturity that often befits students of a much older age group. Throughout the entire day they remained organised, focused and obviously enjoyed the challenges put before them.

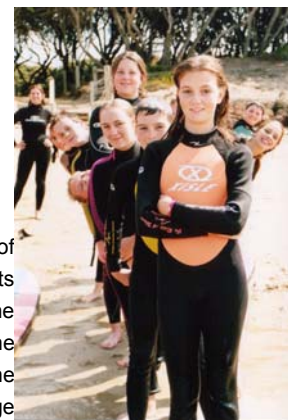

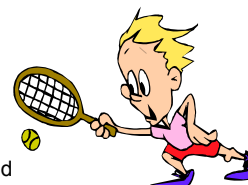

ECCA's Annual Education Lecture

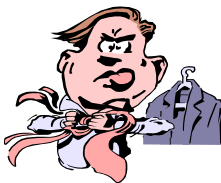

Andrew will present **'Raising Real People' – an insight into the adolescent mind**. Andrew is a clinical psychologist and has worked with many school communities around Australia in the development of a supportive and learning environment and specialises in the well-being of young people and their families.

Andrew's approach is light-hearted and supportive of parents, aware that adolescence is both a time of delight as well as being anxiety-provoking. Andrew has been an advisor to many government and private organisations including David Pennington's Drug Advisory Committee, the TAC, the Department of Education's Suicide Prevention programs, the NSW Drug Education Strategy and the Department of Human Services' programs for high risk children and adolescents. He is the author of 'Raising Real People', 'From Surviving to Thriving', 'Work Smarter not Harder' and 'Beating Bullies'.

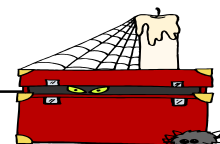
ECCA's Term 1 Fundraiser
