I am writing to you this Christmas to ask whether you can make a gift to help Christian leaders in training at Spurgeon's College to avoid financial difficulty.

Students give up so much to follow God's call

As the Business Manager, it's part of my job to chair the Bursary Committee, which has the joy and anguish of deciding who will get financial help from the College towards their fees and living expenses. It's a joy when we can relieve some of the burden of debt, but anguish when we simply haven't got enough money to go round.

Falling into the hands of loan companies

One student, about to pay their fees, told me they were borrowing money from a loan company to do this. I spoke to them about the dangers of pay-day loans and told them to take their money and pay it back. Another student, applying for a bursary, wrote on the bottom of their form that they were going to sell their car as they needed the money to pay their way through College.

Struggling to make ends meet

Time and again in my current role, and when I was a student here at Spurgeon's College, I have seen students who struggle not only to pay fees but also to make ends meet. They have often moved house, left successful careers and all their support structures behind, to come to College. The need is there, the desire to follow God's calling is evident, but the financial resources are not available.

Student loans are not enough

As you may know, the government will not let students who study with us have as much money in their student loan as those going to public universities. So, even with a loan, **every full time student** has to find at least £2000 extra per year just to pay their fees. And for those who already have a degree, loans are simply not available.

A bursary can relieve the burden

When Remi first heard God's call he was applying for courses in Electrical and Vehicle Engineering and applying for apprenticeships. He had studied a foundation course in theology at a bible school soon after he became a Christian, but as he admits: "I concluded that I didn't want to study theology. One day I went home weeping, because I didn't want God to call me, and I sensed it was going to happen." By the time he got the last rejection from engineering courses at university, God had changed Remi's mind. "I was rather late applying for a place at Spurgeon's College, but I filled in my application form, went for interview and for the first time everything went smoothly. I felt godly peace. Spurgeon's was where I needed to be."



"I was able to get a student loan, so that went straight away to pay my fees. But I also had to use my maintenance loan – that's the government loan for living expenses – to pay off the rest. I was so grateful to be living in College, because it was less expensive than renting elsewhere, and I calculated every penny I spent. But it wasn't enough. As soon as I had paid my rent and fees I was already into an overdraft."

"Having a College bursary made a huge difference. I was able to pay off my overdraft. It took away the burden of worrying about debt."

Remi struggled for two years to keep going. But in his third year, thanks to supporters like you, we were able to award him a College bursary.

Remi was able to complete his course; he graduated in the summer and is now in talks with a local church with a view to taking a leadership role.

I guess like me, you would not want to see Christian leaders in training falling into debt because their money has run out. Our Bursary Committee has assessed their situation carefully and equitably.
