The New Mexico Bureau of Mine Safety provides Instructor Courses to assist you in attaining Mine Safety and Health Administration (MSHA) Certification as an Instructor. It is our intent to provide you with the tools necessary to successfully train miners as well as develop training plans required by the Mine Safety and Health Administration.

There is a \$400 fee for materials and services, payable by check or credit card to the New Mexico Bureau of Mine Safety before the end of the course.

Successful completion of this course, along with detailed information regarding your background and any instructional experience will determine whether the Mine Safety and Health Administration will grant your request for Instructor certification. The information you provide on your application is your direct communication with the MSHA agent who will make the final determination.

Following find an Instructor Candidate Application for you to fill out. Under "Certification of Mining Experience" enter your job related experience working for a mine; "Certification of Instructional Experience" is for you to show us your experience as a teacher; and "Training Received" is for the, mine, health and safety classes you attended.

This application must be received in our office no later than the 1st day of the month in which the Instructor Course is offered. A current resume attached to the application would be very helpful but cannot serve as a substitute for the Instructor candidate application.
