In 2011 in Western Australia, kidney, bladder and urinary tract cancers together accounted for less than five percent of all new cancer cases. However, as both the treatments available for cancer and the role of general practice in cancer care continue to evolve, it is important that GPs remain up-to-date on the latest developments and management of all forms of cancer, including those that occur less frequently.
