INSTAGRAM – YOUR STUDENTS WELLBEING

Unfortunately we are seeing a rise in students who are experiencing harassment or bullying via Instagram. Our year 5-7 teachers are having conversations with the students in their classes about the inappropriate use of using social media to harass or bully other students. Each parent, who wishes their child to use ICT at Stradbroke School, would have signed a Cyber-Safety User Agreement upon enrolling their child. Within this agreement it states:



I will use the Internet, e-mail, mobile phones or any ICT equipment only for positive purposes, not to be mean, rude or offensive, or to bully, harass, or in any way harm anyone else, or the school itself, even if it is meant as a joke.

Consequences will be given to students who do use social media, whether at home or school to harass, bully or offend other members within our community. Can you please discuss this Agreement with your child and if they are using Instagram or other forms of social media please monitor your child's account.

Our 'Play Is the Way' behaviour education concepts are useful when talking to your children about their social media usage.

- "Treat others as you would like them to treat you." A great way for students to reflect on their behaviour.
- "Have reasons for the things you say and do". Another way for students to self-reflect on the choices they make.
- "It takes great strength to be sensible". If a student sees a conversation that they think is inappropriate then the right thing to do is to report to an adult at school or home.

FIRST LANGUAGE MAINTENANCE & DEVELOPMENT

This year we are able to offer FLMD in Chinese and Korean. These programs are only for children from Chinese or Korean language backgrounds and children need to have arrived in Australia no earlier than 2010. We've had some queries from Chinese or Korean speaking families asking if their children (who arrived in Australia before 2010) can attend the Chinese or Korean FLMD Program. We've checked the eligibility requirements and have been told that students who arrived

in Australia before 2010 are not eligible to attend. DECD will be collecting feedback from families later in the year and we will include information about how to provide feedback in a future newsletter. DECD have recommended that families contact the School of Languages or the Ethnic Schools sector for other language opportunities. PUPIL FREE DAY - MONDAY 29 FEBRUARY

Stradbroke staff were involved in a day of professional development on 29/1/16. SSO staff completed first aid training in Anaphylaxis and Asthma.

Teaching staff attended a Moriarta Partnership Conference on STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering & Maths) at Norwood Moriarta HS. Keynote speakers included Sally-Anne Williams from Google and Neil Atkin an Education Consultant from the UK. Both presenters discussed the need to develop creative, divergent and curious learners who embrace challenge and see failure as their **First Attempt In Learning**. In particular, compelling data was provided about the role computer science plays when combined with other disciplines e.g. medicine and computer science are combining to develop a contact lens that can monitor diabetes. A broad selection of workshops enabled staff to explore topics such as computational thinking, coding, 3D design and printing, inquiry, digital technology, robotics and teaching innovation.
