LAW AND ORDER INFORMATION

The Department's Law and Order program is one of the best ways to enhance the image of your Post and The American Legion and at the same time, recognize outstanding individuals within your community.

Contained within this program are several Law and Order Awards available from Department Headquarters. These awards and their criteria are explained below. It is our hope this information will clarify what is available, what each award involves, how they may be requested, and thus increase awareness of the importance Law and Order and its effect on our daily lives.

AWARD #1

The Department has available to Posts, at no charge, Special Certificate Recognition for presentation to Outstanding Police Officers and Firefighters. The Department Commander and Adjutant will sign these certificates and there is space contained for the signatures of the Post Commander and Adjutant.

Contact should be made by Post Officers with Fire and Law Enforcement Departments or related safety forces officials to determine who should be awarded the certificates before arrangements are made for presentation. These certificates may be requested anytime during the membership year.

AWARD #2

The Department of Ohio will recognize the most outstanding Police Officer, Firefighter, and Civilian Life Saver of the Year. Nominations should be submitted by Posts to their District Commander. Districts will judge all nominations and submit one winner for each category per District to:

Department Headquarters no later than 12:00 (NOON) ON FRIDAY, APRIL 8, 2016.

The Department Law and Order Committee will judge the District entries to select the Outstanding Law Enforcement Officer, Firefighter, and Civilian Life Saver of the Year as the Department Winners during their annual meeting. There is no limit that Posts can submit to their respective Districts for judging.

FORM MUST BE SIGNED BY BOTH THE POST AND DISTRICT COMMANDERS TO BE ELIGIBLE FOR JUDGING

35% OF THE JUDGING CRITERIA IS BASED ON COMMUNITY SERVICE – DOCUMENTATION IS REQUIRED.

Community Service, Professional Career, Heroism, Letters of Recognition, news clippings, etc., as well as a copy of the officer's State certification, will be provided. National's guidelines will be followed in addition to The Department of Ohio's guidelines for submission awards to National level.

LAW & ORDER

Taken from the National Memorandum:

The goal is to select a well rounded nominee who has exceeded above and beyond the duty requested of their position.

Only one nominee per year may be entered at the Department level.

Consideration for a posthumous award will only be given if the nominee's death occurred after being selected and is within the dates for which the award is being presented.

To be considered for an award:

- 1. a completed Department nomination form must be presented
- 2. a 5x7 photo must be included
- 3. A maximum of 18 one sided pages may be included showing the individual's service narrative, supporting citations and newspaper clippings.

Failure to follow these criteria will disqualify your submission.

The nominee (for police and fire) must be recommended by his or her Commanding Officer or supervisor in order to receive the award.

The breakdown for the judging point system is as follows:

Community Service-----35 points

Professional Career-----40 points

Heroism-----20 points

Letters of Recognition, news clippings and other substantiating documentation

-----5 points

Citations for community service, heroism and meritorious performance of duty should be explained for the past year and may include previous years. Include citations and any supporting letters from the nominee's chain of command as well as other documentation from city, county, state authorities and American Legion officials, citizens or civic groups as further evidence of community service, heroic and meritorious performance of duty by the nominee.
