## NURSERY SCHOOL

- May 14 \& 15: Music \& Movement


## JK/SK

- Last week we learned the consonant blends, "scr," "spr," "spl," and "str."
- We have learned 100 words in SK this year. We will be reviewing them now, and then using those words to build more.
- Our class will have a part in the upcoming Spring Music. Performances will take place Wednesday, May 7, Thursday, May 8, at 7:00pm and Friday, May 9 at 1:30pm for the Grandparents. Our part is at the beginning of the Musical so please take your child home early. We will leave the gym after our part and go out to the Crush Area. You may pick up your child there. The students will get to see the whole musical on Friday afternoon from start to finish. Children will need to wear dark pants. Our navy uniform pants will be acceptable. T-shirts are being purchased for the whole student body to wear. We will be roses and doing actions while the choir sings our school theme song. I have made rose hats for the girls. They will need to wear their hair down on those days. Boys will be the leaves. These will be attached to their shirts.
- Please have your child complete their Space project and bring it to school on or before Wednesday, May 7. I have many projects returned already. The students will be presenting them on Wednesday.
- Please respond quickly to the SK Graduation information.
- Our end of year Field Trip will take place on Wednesday, June 18. We will leave at 8:30am sharp and return at about $3: 30 \mathrm{pm}$. The cost is still to be determined. Forms will be sent home as soon as we know.
- Please return your child's washed quiet time blanket as soon as possible.
- I look forward to seeing you all at the Fun Fair and Legacy Ceremony next Friday.


## GRADE 1/2

- We celebrated the end of the Arctic animal presentations last Thursday with ice cream
sundaes. I am very proud of the children's efforts. They all did a wonderful job! They presented their projects to the Kindergarten class and this week we hope to present them to Grades 7 and 8. On Friday afternoon, we will set up the projects in our classroom so that Grandparents and friends can see them.
- With regards to the musical, students are to report to our classroom and get into their costumes at 7:00 p.m. They will remain in the classroom until their performance time. Their part in the musical occurs just before intermission. I would strongly suggest students get changed and go home at this time. With the excitement the musical creates all week plus two late evenings I expect the children will be extremely tired which usually results in a lot of tears and misunderstandings. Our class will not miss out on seeing the musical because we will watch it Friday afternoon.
- Bible: We will be learning about the early Christian Church.
- Math: The children are doing well with the money unit. Grade one students will continue working on counting money up to a dollar. Grade two students and some grade one students will be working on giving back change.
- Language: We will be reading an African Cinderella story this week.
- SES: We are learning about the power of air (push and pull are the key words).
- Our end of year Field Trip will take place on Wednesday, June 18. We will leave at 8:30am sharp and return at about $3: 30 \mathrm{pm}$. The cost is still to be determined. Forms will be sent home as soon as we know.


## GRADE 3/4

- Spelling - Lesson 32 workbook exercises and dictation are due on Friday.
- Writing - Some students are still putting the finishing touches on their biographies. We will be sharing them aloud with each other this week.
- Bible - Due to musical practices, the Elijah projects were not assigned or sent home last week. I apologize for any confusion. We will take
a look at them this week, and I will assign a new due date next Monday.

## GRADE 5/6

- Math - Checking Ins were marked and will be shown to the students today. I will keep them for the progress envelope which will be sent home on Thursday. In the last portion of the math program I do not adhere to the 'subject days'. Instead, we will focus in on certain areas for several days in a row, covering the last few concepts of the year. Please ensure that your child has filed daily work as some will be from text and some handouts. This will ensure easier access to daily work for Checking Ins, quizzes, or tests. Thank you!
- Bible - A detailed review is being completed in class and will be used to assist with a unit test on May 15th. Memory Verses will be shared starting Wednesday.
- Spelling - Lesson 31 - Friday
- Grammar - Lesson 22 - due Monday
- Literature - We are continuing with short stories unit on Medieval Fantasy. Two Book Reports are due June 13th.
- Gym - We will be starting Track and Field training next week, so please have appropriate outdoor gym clothes.
- SES - Handouts were great! Presentations will start next week.
- *Despite the craziness of the musical, the students have been very focused in class and have earned their happy faces for the month of April! We will celebrate with a class party on Wednesday at 11am. Snacks are welcome and we will save some for another day if there are too many as we don't want sore tummies for opening night!
- *Progress Envelopes containing April's work will be coming home on Wednesday. Please empty,
review material with your child, sign, and return the envelope by Monday.
