#### **BOOTH INFORMATION**

The booth spaces are 8-foot tables, draped, and will be located in **Salon A** of the Grand Ballroom. This will be right next to the session rooms and will provide easy access to seminar participants. **Seminar breaks will occur in Salon A.** The booths will include electricity and internet access, **IF** selected during your registration process. Making these selections will assist in determining expenses for NCCCMA.

Booth setup can occur on Thursday morning, June 28<sup>rd</sup>, as early as 9:00 a.m., and no later than 3:00 p.m. Please note that seminar attendees will be arriving at various times on Thursday

depending upon whether or not they will play golf. The official start of the seminar is Friday morning, but there will be an opening reception in the Top of the Plaza on Thursday evening beginning at 6:00 p.m. Exhibitors need to have their booths open at 7:30 am on Friday, June 29<sup>th</sup>.

Booths can be taken down at the end of Friday's reception at 7:30 p.m. <u>There are NO Saturday exhibits</u>; however, if you choose not to breakdown Friday evening after the reception, you may wait until the seminar adjourns at noon on Saturday to breakdown.
