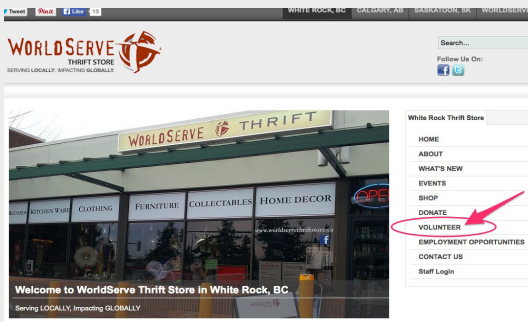

It sure is nice to have nature return to its normal state after a long cold winter! So, this activity will help bring the life back to your own yard!

Hummingbird's Sugar-Water

What you will need:

- A proper hummingbird feeder
- Normal White Sugar
- Water
- Measuring Cups
- Cooking Pot



Directions:

Make sure that you have a proper hummingbird feeder. You can normally find them in the nature department of certain stores. They don't look like your average bird feeder; hummingbird feeders are usually red, and have a water tank and small holes in the sides.

Hummingbirds love nectar; it's what keeps them going ... LITERALLY! So this next step needs a lot of paying attention to as the sugar-water can go bad when left outside for numerous days. Take the measuring cup and fill it with 1 cup of sugar (for every cup of sugar, you need 4 cups of water) and pour in a pot.

*Make sure you use regular white sugar; refrain from using any substitutes like brown sugar, sweeteners, and food coloring, it can harm the insides of a hummingbird!

After you have made the solution, put the pot on a heated surface and stir until the water is boiling and the sugar is dissolved. Do not boil for too long. The boiled water purifies the water and the sugar so that it stays fresh longer. Find a suitable container for your solution cover it and let it cool down in the refrigerator.

*You should check on the water Daily. It might need to get changed, or even refilled!

Facts about Hummingbirds:

• Hummingbirds are believed to be attracted to the color red (which is why their feeders are red!)

• A hummingbird's wings can flap up to seventy times per second!

• A hummingbird's brain is 4.2% of its body weight, and its heart takes up 2.5%!

• A hummingbird's heart can beat up to 1,260 times a minute and 250 times a minute when at rest!

• Hummingbirds are the only known bird to be able to fly in place, fly sideways, backwards and even upside down!
