- 4. Any added costs to you.
- 5. What happens if you decide to stop participating.
- 6. When you will be told about new findings which may affect your willingness to participate.
- 7. How many people will be in the study.

If you agree to participate, you must be given a signed copy of this document and a written summary of the research.
