#### "Building our Legacy"

As we celebrate our 12<sup>th</sup> year as a parish, we give thanks to God for His grace and abundant blessings. Since our earliest days, we continue to expand and flourish. We gratefully acknowledge our past and our present by building for our future. To further develop this holy ground for our Catholic Community on its spiritual journey through life, we would like to embark on the construction of a Parish Life Center- a facility to accommodate all of our parishioners. <u>PROPOSED PARISH LIFE CENTER</u>

#### Parish Community Hall

The construction of a Parish Community Hall will provide our parish community the opportunity to host numerous social, spiritual and ministerial events which are critical to our growth as a family of faith. A large gathering hall would make it possible to gather our community together for Parish Retreats, missions, concerts, spaghetti dinners and many more activities. Critical to the construction of this hall would be the addition of a Commercial Kitchen. Finally, our parish will be able to host virtually any social activity with refreshments and food as well as expand our ability to serve the needy.

#### Multi-Purpose Classrooms/ Meeting Rooms

Our present accommodations for Faith Formation consist of rolling dividers that create a temporary classroom space for learning. It is our hope to create a more permanent educational learning environment by creating multipurpose classroom/meeting rooms. These rooms will also provide much needed meeting space to serve the dozens of ministry programs in our growing parish.

#### Courtyard

God has blessed us with wonderful weather here in Ft. Myers! In this plan, we wish to create a courtyard between the Church and Parish Life Center where parishioners can come to "be outside" while still at home in their parish. This courtyard can also be an outdoor gathering area to host parish receptions, small group gatherings, prayer activities and more. A wonderful way to give Glory to God for the blessing of nature!

#### Nursery and Youth Room

While it is always important to engage and involve the adult community of our parish, our plan also wishes to meet the needs of younger members of our parish community. A new Nursery and Youth room opens our hearts to the very young in the community as we nurture their faith and welcome them as the future of our parish.

#### Choir Rehearsal Room:

Our choir is a critical part of our liturgical experience as we celebrate the E ucharist each Sunday. So many members of our parish give graciously of their time and their talents to enhance our worship and fill our Church with song. A rehearsal room would provide a space where the choir can continue to practice, to work together and to continuously improve our liturgies. Welcoming new members would be an additional asset to this aspect of the project.

#### Parish Administrative Offices:

Our parish is blessed with dedicated staff members who diligently support and implement the operations of our parish community. Our present administrative space is already inadequate for the present staff. In the campaign effort, we wish to be able to provide a positive work space for our current staff as well as to strategically prepare for our future.

#### Additional Parking

The addition of the new Parish Life Center will require an expansion of our present parking. This new parking area will provide parking spaces for parishioners for larger social events, ministry activities and also for liturgies during the high season

#### Stewarding God's creation with an Environmentally-friendly design

To ensure that we are good stewards of God's creation, our new space will feature "green" elements. This will also help save on long-term maintenance and operational costs.

New construction of the Parish Life Center is an opportunity to utilize the latest technology and building methods to produce a structure that is ecologically sustainable.

We are grateful that God has made us responsible stewards!!!

#### ACHIEVING OUR VISION

In accordance with diocesan policy, it is our goal as a parish family to raise \$4.0-4.5 million over the next three years. The overall estimated cost of the Parish Life Center is \$6.0 million. The parish will mortgage the remaining balance. **Our parish goal and estimated project costs will not be finalized until the results of the feasibility study are complete.**

**Children's Liturgy of the Word** is a program for children ages 4 to 10 that takes place each Sunday during the 9:15 & 11:15 Masses. After the opening prayer, the children along with their Catechist move to the chapel to hear and discuss the Sunday readings at a level they will understand. At the offertory the children return to the assembly for the remainder of the Mass. There is no registration required for Children's Liturgy of the Word. While we want this to be a fun and engaging time for the children, they are expected to behave in an appropriate manner respectful to adults and to God's House. Please talk to your child about this before having them attend Children's Liturgy of the Word. Because this is a guided lesson, we ask that children younger than age 4 do not attend. If you would like more information, or to be a part of this program, **please contact Chris Biel at 561-7499.** 

**Baptism:** Congratulations on your decision to baptize your child! At Saint John XXIII we are happy to help your family prepare for the celebration. Baptisms are offered for registered members of Saint John XXIII and are scheduled only after the preparation process is completed by the parents. Please do not make arrangements for family members until you have actually received a date. Contact the office at 561-2245 for more information or to begin the process.

First Communion (also called First Eucharist) and First Reconciliation: Children in First grade or above, who have expressed a desire and willingness and are attending Mass, are welcome to begin the two year process of preparing for these Sacraments. The first year consists of regular attendance at Faith Formation classes or through a Diocesan Catholic school. (either St. Francis Xavier or St. Andrew) The second year continues those classes, but also adds in direct Sacramental Preparation (Reconciliation and Communion) sessions. Contact Chris at 561-7499 for more information or to begin the process. Parents who home school their children must contact the office during Year I.

**Confirmation Preparation** to celebrate the Sacrament of Confirmation is also a two year process that now begins at the start of 9th Grade and is celebrated at the end of 10th grade. (Older teens are certainly welcome also!). Each year consists of Faith Formation through the parish Youth Group or a Diocesan Catholic school (Bishop Verot) as well as scheduled Confirmation classes and a retreat.Please note: Students from Bishop Verot must register and attend the preparation classes at the beginning of 9th grade.



#### Gospel Reflections | Jack Conroy

#### Matthew 25:14-30. More on the End Time

This is the second of three parables that describe behavior appropriate for being ready for the "End Times." The image of the Master leaving and returning underlies all three parables (last week's, this week's and next week's) as the Church Year comes to a close. In this parable, however, it appears that activity consistent with that of "the world" is what is desirous. Or, at a minimum, the parable eschews "conservative" action! The servant who was called "worthless" is the one who took no risk with the funds. In fact, the Rabbis tell us that if a person buried funds entrusted to him or her and they were for some reason lost, that person was not responsible! The upshot is that those who risked capital and won were ushered into the joys of the Master; he who took no risk was thrown into darkness. What, for the Matthaean community was "risk?" What was "conservative" action? Is it possible that being a follower of Jesus was "risky?" Was it safer not to accept the Gospel? Is that perhaps true today? Is it possible that the Gospel challenges each and every age of the Church, and that the choice of being satisfied with externals in the Church, taking no risk with the radical example of Our Lord identifies us with the one we don't want to be identified with? Who, here, is the "child of the Light?"






