ACTIVITY CHOICES

Following is the list of Activities taught at Nakanawa with a brief description of each one. Please use this list as a guide when completing the SKILLS portion of this application.

ARTS & CRAFTS

ARTS & CRAFTS: A wide variety of crafts are taught, such a needlework, macramé, painting, weaving, jewelry making, sculpture, and paper mache'. A basic knowledge of many different skills is desired. Offered in Junior, Intermediate and Senior Camp during both sessions.

CERAMICS: A basic knowledge of clay, glazes, and how to fire an electric kiln. Offered during the Four Week session in Intermediate & Senior Camp only.

DANCE

DANCE: Modern and Aerobic dance offered in Senior Camp only. A knowledge of routines for teaching is helpful. A dance program is held at the close of the Four Week session. Dance in the Two Week Sessions and Junior Four Week is combined with the Musical and Operetta productions. Choreography experience is welcomed.

TUMBLING/MAT GYMNASTICS: Offered in Junior Camp only and combined with Games. Basic knowledge of tumbling/gymnastics skills needed with emphasis on safety.

LAND SPORTS

All have competitions between the Amazon and Valkyrie Teams. All require a thorough knowledge of skills, rules, drills and teaching techniques.

ARCHERY: American Archery Association rules and classifications used. Offered in Junior, Intermediate and Senior Camp, both sessions.

FENCING: Offered during Four Week Session in Intermediate & Senior Camp only.

FIELD GAMES/TEAM SPORTS/RELAYS: Offered in Junior Camp for both sessions and Intermediate Camp for the Two Week Session. Newcomb, softball, volleyball, soccer, and simple relay games are played for fun and competitively. A basic knowledge of a wide variety of games and relays is best.

GOLF: Basics are taught at camp with a putting green and driving cage. Offered in Intermediate & Senior Camp only both sessions.

RIFLERY: Offered in Senior Camp only during Four Week Session. National Riflery Association rules and classifications are used. Must have basic knowledge of rifles, how to clean and fix minor problems. Emphasis on safety.

SOCCER: Offered in Four Week Intermediate and Senior Camps.

SOFTBALL: Offered in Four Week Intermediate and Senior Camps.

TABLE TENNIS: Offered in Four Week Intermediate and Senior Camps.

TENNIS: All campers take tennis. Offered all sessions. The more experience the better, but counselors are needed to work with beginner, advanced beginner, intermediate, and advanced players. A sound knowledge of the basics is essential.

VOLLEYBALL: Offered in Four Week Intermediate and Senior Camps.

RUNNING: Offered in Four Week Intermediate and Senior Camps.

DRAMA/MUSIC

ACTING/SHORT ONE ACT PLAYS: Offered in Four Week Intermediate and Senior Camps. Performed in the "Little Theatre" with stage and costumes at the end of the session.

CHOIR/OCTET: Special activity offered in Four Week Intermediate and Senior Camps. Anyone can participate in Choir but Octet is selected from Choir/Octet campers who audition to be a member of the eight camper singing group. They perform all the special team songs for special events and Trophy Night. The choir/octet also performs in Crossville for a civic group and/or senior citizen organization. Popular, folk, silly, and religious songs are all appropriate. Music is available but we encourage you to bring any special selections you feel would be appropriate. Glee Club, Choir/Octet, Musical or Operetta are all included during Glee Club teaching activity.

MUSICAL PRODUCTION: Performed the final day of the Two Week Session in both camps. Short, cute, clever & simple 30 minute musical involving every camper. Seven teaching groups in Junior and 4 teaching groups in Intermediate with approximately 20 girls in each group.

OPERETTA PRODUCTION: Performed the final day of the Junior Four Week Session. It is a short production of a major musical such as "Annie" or "The Lion King" which lasts an hour or less. We have a collection of past performances including scripts, music, and set designs. Incorporates music, dance and drama. 6 teaching groups with 15-20 in each group.

HAND BELLS: three octaves of brass hand bells are available for use in either camp. Ability to read music and teach basics of rhythm and sight-reading is needed. Played for church and special programs.

GLEE CLUB: Music is an important ingredient of camp life. Camp songs are taught to our new campers and any other songs that would be fun for the group to sing. Popular, folk, silly, and religious. A piano is available in each camp along with music and camp song books. The instructor is responsible for music on Sundays for church (prelude, offertory, hymns, postlude). This is a great opportunity for small groups of campers to perform their skills. Operetta, Musical and Choir/Octet are included with Glee Club.

MUSICAL INSTRUMENTS: Not an activity but if you play a musical instrument, it would be a wonderful addition to our music program with opportunities to play for church, special events and to share with campers.

NATURE (Offered in Junior Camp only both sessions) Knowledge, love and care of animals and plants and ability to share this appreciation with the campers.

CLIMBING (Safety Certification required and provided by Nakanawa 6/12/12-6/14/12)

BOULDERING WALL: Horizontal and vertical climbing wall. Thorough knowledge of basic climbing and belaying skills required. Offered in Junior Camp only both sessions.

CLIMBING WALL & TOWER/ZIP LINE/CHALLENGE ELEMENTS/GIANT SWING: Must have thorough knowledge of climbing wall and zip line operations including belaying, safety precautions, and basic training. Offered in Intermediate and Senior Camp only both sessions.

HORSEBACK RIDING (arrive Monday, June 11 if possible to prepare horses and barn)

BASIC ENGLISH RIDING: English riding is taught with emphasis on learning the basics of riding, handling the horses, grooming, ring instruction, trail riding, barn management, and care of tack. There are about 24 camp owned horses and the riding staff assists with the feeding, watering, grooming and general care of the horses and barn.

WATERFRONT (must have current Lifeguard Training Certificate to instruct-LGT Class offered at Nakanawa 6/10/-6/14)

CANOEING: Every camper learns the basic strokes (bow, J, J sweep, front sweep, back sweep, backwater, pull to, push away) and handling of a canoe and rowboat. Calm water paddling with emphasis on form and grace. Strokes, lines and landings passed to become a qualified bow or stern and then progress to blading (one person in a canoe) or war canoe crew (10 people in a canoe).

WAR CANOE: War Canoe "coxes", elected by respective teams, choose their 10 member crew to compete in either race or drill. Must know basic strokes and help with preparations for the race and drill competitions.

DIVING: Ability to teach all basic dives and work on optionals with advanced divers. One meter boards only.

LIFEGUARD TRAINING: Offered in Four Week Senior Camp only. Must have WSI and be qualified to teach the certified Red Cross Lifeguard Training course and give written test and practicals.

SWIMMING: All campers take swimming. Emphasis is on form and endurance (racing and distance) swimming. Swimming meets held with races, relays, and form. Basic Red Cross strokes are taught (front crawl, elementary back stroke, breast stroke, side stroke, back crawl).

SAILING: Basic sailing is taught with written tests on knots, parts of the sailboat, etc. Seven Sunfish sailboats available. Offered in Four Week Intermediate and Senior Camp only.

DAILY CAMP LIFE

LIBRARIAN: Beverly Green Memorial Library in Senior Camp. Catalog books, promote reading & listening to music, maintain and encourage use of Library. Hostess for Nakanawa Reunion Groups and Weekend Visitors.

COMMISSARY/MAIL: Camp store and mail house located in both camps. Store is open each day following rest hour and in Senior at 11:00am for a Snack Break. Responsible for stocking store and selling items (stamps, stationery, shampoo, etc)

DINING HALL HOSTESS: In charge of 25 "aides" (campers that request to help) who set, serve and clear the tables. Responsibilities include working with the kitchen staff, monitoring the dining hall during meals, and setting up weekly seating charts. Also need to help campers & counselors with special diet needs (gluten free, PKU, etc.). Definite set of guidelines to follow provided.

NURSE: There are Infirmaries in both Junior and Senior Camps and the Nurse is on call at all times. Living quarters are provided in the infirmaries and there is a doctor available at all times. All medications needed by the campers are kept in their respective infirmaries. Contact Nakanawa for more details.

TEAM SPONSOR: Must be a former Amazon or Valkyrie camper. One or two counselors needed to sponsor the Amazon or Valkyrie Teams. Responsibilities include helping with team elections, team parties, and any questions or problems that might arise. Gather needed supplies.

NEWSLETTER EDITOR: A camp newsletter is written each week, turned into the Senior Camp Office on Sunday night, and then sent to the parents. It must be well written and contain details and highlights of all camp events and daily life.

FOOD SERVICE/KITCHEN STAFF: arrive 6/3/12-leave 7/30/12 Responsibilities include helping to prepare, cook and clean up after meals; cleaning and maintenance of kitchen and dining hall; washing all dishes, pots and pans following the meals; unloading delivery truck and stocking pantry, coolers & freezers on Wednesday mornings.

EGYPT MAINTENANCE: arrive 6/13/12-leave 7/30/12 Responsible for cleaning and maintenance of Egypt (bath house) every day with one or two big cleanings weekly. This includes all toilets, showers, and sinks in the main Egypt and also Little Egypt (men's).

PHOTOGRAPHER: Responsible for taking pictures in both Junior and Senior Camps to post on Web Site and use in our promotional DVD. Videographer skills would be very useful also.

OFFICE ASSISTANT: arrive 6/3/12-leave 7/30/12 Assist Secretary in Senior Camp Main Office. Organizational skills, proof reading, etc.

All activities and committees have notebooks with directions and guidelines. These are available upon arrival at Nakanawa. Counselors and Staff are welcome to arrive prior to Orientation and Heads of Activities are encouraged to do so.

We will give staff working BOTH SESSIONS first consideration.
