THE CRITICAL PIECE MDS 3.0

This fast paced interactive two-day training is designed to review the structure of the MDS 3.0 Assessment process and identify the numerous changes that have been made in 2015 and will be implemented in 2016. This is an important session for Nursing Home Administrators, clinical and financial leadership, and interdisciplinary team members. The MDS 3.0 database is the foundation of care planning, payment and quality measurements (QM's) as well as the core of data for regulatory review.

This comprehensive review of this central data collection process will assist team members to have the most current and detailed information about the MDS 3.0 assessment, current regulatory compliance rules and the implications for payment and survey. Nursing Home Administrators need specific information about the assessment process and the impact of the MDS 3.0 data to properly manage the facility and its risks.

In 2016, there will be many structural, definitional and data utilization changes. The program will include the following topics.

- Identify the structure and requirements for the MDS 3.0 assessment process
- New assessment data and scheduling issues
- HIPPA concerns and Privacy Act statement requirements
- RAI manual changes and resources
- Impact of the definitions and structure in the RAI manual on the overall compliance
- Section by section review of the MDS 3.0 assessment form with a focus on key changes, definitions and coding issues and the administrative responsibilities
- Define new sections and definitions for completion of the MDS 3.0

- Interview issues and proper documentation in the medical record
- Clinical measurements and policy development
- Impact of new data on Medicare payment systems
- Review the data and program requirements for the MDS accuracy survey process with implications for administrative and clinical staff
- Discuss education and training programs necessary to orient and train staff working with the MDS 3.0 assessment
- Identify the prospective changes to the federal payment program in 2016-2017 that will be impacting the MDS database
- Education training issues and resources for MDS managers and members of the IDT
