# Bayview Medical Services

All welcome.

We wish to invite friends and patients of Bayview Medical Services to celebrate the 30 year commitment to our practice by Mrs Karyn Speed upon her retirement on Friday 12th February 2016 at the clinic between 2.30pm and 4.00pm.

Tumby Bay Surgery are running a Q Fever vaccination clinic on 10th February 2016 targeted at adults who work with sheep, cattle or wildlife.

There are two steps to the process:

1. A blood test and skin test to ensure you have not been exposed to the disease.
2. Return to have doctor review the skin test and blood results. Vaccination is then given at this time.

The cost of the vaccine is approximately \$130. All visits to the GP will be bulkbilled for this service. Vaccination is once only for lifetime coverage.

Tumby Bay Clinic is registered with the Australian Q Fever Register. Participants can choose to have their Q Fever status listed on the register.

Also during months of January and February Dr Sara Georg is encouraging all patients who have asthma to visit the surgery for an asthma review and care plan. School age children will receive an asthma management plan in readiness for the new school year.

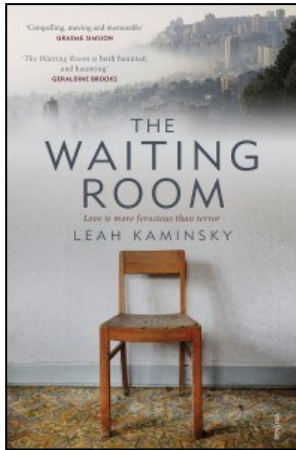

The reality of life in Israel is deftly displayed in this compelling book.

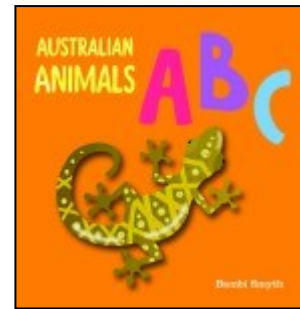


### ***Reckoning* by Magda Szubanski**

### ***Australian Animals ABC* by Bambi Smyth**

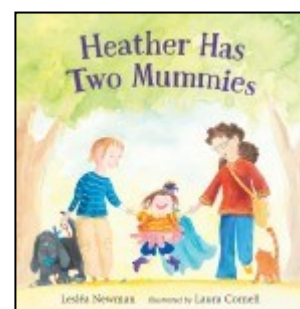
Australian illustrator, Bambi Smyth, has created an energetic and vast pool of Australian animals who will swim, hop, climb and fly their way into young reader's imaginations.

Olly was born in March 1890 at Bergen (Norway), his father being Nils Jorgenson Thorsheim. There is little known of his family, other than his father was a fisherman.

It is thought that he went to school in Bergen, commencing in 1896. On completion of schooling he joined the fishing fleet in Norway before moving to Australia and becoming a naturalised Australian citizen. He recorded his occupation as "sailor" at time of enlistment. It is thought he first came to Tumbly Bay on one of the grain ships operating in the area, but then took up farm work in the Butler Tanks area on the property of Thomas Edmond (Ted) Hudson, Section 17 Hundred of Butler.

On enlistment he was posted to A company, 2<sup>nd</sup> Depot Battalion (Bn) at Mitcham to complete a very short period of training, before being transferred to 6<sup>th</sup> Reinforcements/32<sup>nd</sup> Bn. On 11 April 1916 he embarked at Adelaide aboard HMAT "Aeneas" bound for Alexandria. After a further short period of training with his unit, he (and his unit) was on the move again, this time embarking aboard HMAT "Huntsend" bound for Marseilles; arriving on 30 June 1916. On arrival he was immediately placed into isolation at 24<sup>th</sup> General Hospital with German measles where he remained for almost 2 months until re-joining his unit.

The 32<sup>nd</sup> Bn had been raised in Adelaide on 8 August 1915 with men from SA and WA. The unit was sent originally to Egypt and then on to France, destined for the Western Front. The Bn was involved in its first major battle only 3 days after entering the front line trenches in July 1916: this was the battle of Fromelles and it was a disaster for the unit, which suffered 718 casualties during the attack – about 90% of its fighting strength. The 5<sup>th</sup> Division, of which the Bn formed part, suffered 5533 casualties. The Australian War Memorial describes the battle as "the worst 24 hours in Australia's entire history... (in the war)".

It was after this battle that Olly re-joined his unit on 7 August 1916. The unit had been withdrawn from the front line and although it did rotate through the line, it saw no further major action for the remainder of 1916. However, Olly was again admitted to hospital in November 1916 – this time he was evacuated to the War Hospital in UK with "Trench Feet". It must have been a severe case, firstly because of the evacuation and secondly because he did not re-join his unit for 6 months; his unit, during his absence was involved in a series of follow up actions as the Germans withdrew to the Hindenburg Line.

The next major action in which the Bn was involved was during the third battle of Ypres at Polygon Wood (Belgium) from 26 September to 3 October 1917. It was in the concluding stages of this battle that Olly was killed in action (KIA) on 30 September 1917.

He is buried at Tyne Cot Military Cemetery, 5 miles (8 km) east- north east of Ypres. This is the largest Military Cemetery in the world, containing over 12000 graves - more than 75% of which have the inscription "known only to God".

His name is also recorded on the Memorial at Tumbly Bay.

Even though Olly was a naturalised Australian Citizen, his parents still lived in Norway, so once again the difficulty and delay in passage of information at this time is brought starkly to the fore. It was almost a year later before his parents were made aware of the death of their son!
