Senior Privilege Program Policies

Undergraduate students in the Bagwell College of Education have the privilege of beginning a nondegree (certifications, endorsements, add-ons) program, at the graduate level, before they have completed their Bachelor's degree. This would allow them to complete their BS degree, achieve teacher certification and have an endorsement to their certificate as they enter the workforce, thus making them more attractive in the job market.

Policies:

- Must complete BCOE Senior Privilege Program Application
- Must have the approval of undergraduate advisor/department chair
- Must have the approval of graduate program director/department chair
- Must have approval of the Graduate College Dean
- Must have a minimum GPA of 3.0 in coursework at KSU
- Must be within 30 hours of graduation
- Can take a maximum of 9 hours of graduate coursework

Understandings:

- Students will remain as an undergraduate student in the Banner system until they have been granted their Bachelor's degree.
- Students will pay undergraduate tuition for the graduate courses.
- Students will be manually registered for the courses by Graduate Admissions.
- Student must receive a B or better in each course before being allowed to register for subsequent courses. Any grade below a B will result in withdrawal of non-degree graduate privilege.
- No graduate courses taken as part of this program will count towards the student's undergraduate program.
- If a student wishes to continue into a Master's program they must apply, meet all admission criteria in place at the time, and be formally accepted into the program.
- If accepted into a Master's program, the student may bring up to 9 hours from their non-degree status into the program, when appropriate and with the program directors approval.
