This past Thursday was Ascension Thursday, the day Jesus was taken up to heaven after rising from the dead and appearing to many. Jesus had instructed his apostles and close disciples to pray for the Holy Spirit that He would send to them. The nine days between Ascension Thursday and Pentecost, when the

Holy Spirit was sent and descended up on the apostles, is the first novena in the church. Novena comes from the Latin word for nine. Nine days of prayer, waiting for and preparing for the Holy Spirit. With my moving in and settling in, I forgot to mention this last week. Although you may have missed praying specifically for the outpouring of the Holy Spirit between Thursday and today, I encourage you to pray the rest of this week for the Holy Spirit to descend upon you more deeply than ever before next week when we celebrate Pentecost. The Holy Spirit is the third person of the Holy Trinity. He is the Love between the Father and the Son. The Father loves the Son and the Son loves the Father in return. Their love bursts forth into the third person of the Trinity, the Holy Spirit. Jesus loves us just as the Father loves Him and His love to us is also the Holy Spirit. When we pray for the Holy Spirit to fill us more deeply, we are actually praying for the very love of God to be alive more deeply in us. When the Love of God is Alive in us, imagine how on fire we could really be. We can be like those first disciples of Jesus and spread the Word of God and His Love with such enthusiasm that it would convert others. Remember, this enthusiasm and Love of the first Christians is what converted the Romans to Christianity. They could not believe that those they were persecuting and killing were returning love and kindness to them. Pray this week that the Holy Spirit continues to fill you, and that you are open to Him, so that you may convert all in your path with the same enthusiasm.

PENTECOST! What a beautiful day for <u>Deacon Elect Rick Tucek to celebrate His first Mass assisting as a deacon</u>. May he be filled with the Holy Spirit in this new ministry. CONGRATULATIONS RICK! ALLELUIA! We are so proud of you and are honored to have your vocation as Deacon born and nourished in our parish.

As I mentioned I had previously made plans to be away with family next weekend. I will pray for you on the special Feast of Pentecost.

I know this is a long standing tradition here at St Bernadette for confessions to be at 1:00 PM on Saturdays, but I am thinking of making 2 or 3 different times available to replace the 1:00 PM time. This will help our schedule in many ways with the lack of priest help as well as giving more flexibility to people for weddings. The collected waste oil is filtered first and then re-used as a cleaner-burning alternative fuel. This year, ReFuel Pgh collected over 556 gallons of oil from 20 churches. St. Bernadette donated 72 gallons, which can run a diesel engine pick-up truck for 1,140 miles! ReFuel Pgh also accepts donations of waste vegetable oil from home cooking and frying.
