STUDYING GERMAN AT A-LEVEL embraces many skills. As well as honing their linguistic skills, students will develop excellent communication and personal skills by working with partners, in small groups and giving presentations. Independent research will involve reading authentic sources such as newspapers, magazines and websites. Students will access a range of media including TV programmes, video clips, films and MP3 downloads.

Knowledge of grammar is essential to the study of a language at a higher level and this is taught throughout the course. Translation is employed to extend comprehension. Language students can give their opinions and arguments on a range of contemporary topics.

The topics studied overlap with History, Geography, Ethics, Science and Technology, Literature and Film.
