WHAT IS THIS "EXERCISE CORNER"?

As some of you may know, my backgrounds lies with Exercise and Fitness. I have previously worked as an Exercise Specialist and Fitness Class Instructor at a facility that was geared towards senior citizens. Exercise has tremendous benefits at all stages of life. As we age it becomes more and more important to be physically active. For this reason, I am starting "Erin's Exercise Corner". I will feature a monthly exercise geared towards strength, flexibility, or neuromotor function. I will include detailed instructions and photos to help guide you through the exercise. As you perform the exercise you may feel a stretch, but you should never feel any pain. If you do experience pain, stop the exercise as you may not be performing it correctly or you may have other complications that do not allow you to perform the specific exercise. If you ever have any questions about performing the exercise in "Erin's Exercise Corner", or are looking for further exercises to help improve something, please don't hesitate to ask. One of the top reasons people enter nursing homes is due to decreased range of motion (not being able to reach up into the cupboards or bend over to pick something up off the floor). These exercises are intended to maintain or improve your range of motion, and improve your balance and neuromotor behavior to help decrease your risk for falls. So read on and try something new! Try doing these exercises together at club meetings and sharing with others!



Erin's Exercise Corner

CHAIR MARCHING

- 1. Start seated tall in your chair, scooted about half way forward so your butt is on the front half of the chair.
- 2. Lift one leg so your foot leaves the ground (Option 1) or as far as you can lift leaving your toes on the ground to press up on if needed (Option 2).
- 3. In a controlled motion, slowly set your foot back on the ground.
- 4. Repeat with other foot.
- 5. Repeat 10 times on each leg.
- 6. Try repeating 3 times each day.

This is a *strengthening* exercise to improve leg strength.

FEATURED RECIPE: PUMPKIN SOUP

Ingredients

- 3 Cups water
- 1/4 pound beef round roast, thawed, sliced thinly
- 2 cans (~30 ounces) low-sodium pumpkin
- 2 tablespoons maple syrup (or 2 tablespoons brown sugar)
- 1/4 teaspoons black pepper
- 1/2 teaspoon ground cinnamon
- 1/4 cup onions, diced

Directions

- 1. In a medium-size pot, bring water to a boil.
- 2. Add beef roast to boiling water. Boil for 5 to 10 minutes.
- 3. Add pumpkin, maple syrup, and pepper to pot. If using cinnamon, add that too. Mix well.
- 4. Lower heat and cook for about 10 minutes.
- 5. Put 2 teaspoons of onion on top of each bowl of soup. Serve hot. Serves 6

Tips for cooking beef roast: The recommended safe minimum internal temperature for beef roast is 145 degrees F
