### What Is UTeach?

UTeach is a nationally recognized program that prepares science, technology, engineering, and mathematics (STEM) majors to become teachers. Forty-four universities in 21 states and the District of Columbia are transforming the preparation of secondary STEM teachers through UTeach. Each year, these universities and others come together for three days of meetings, interactive presentations, hands-on workshops, and panels and discussions devoted to strengthening STEM education.

### Why Support UTeach?

STEM skills are in demand. There are 1.9 STEM jobs for every unemployed person in the U.S., yet only 10% of college degrees are awarded in STEM fields. UTeach increases the number of high-quality STEM majors who enter teaching, stay in teaching, and are prepared to engage and challenge students in STEM learning through inquiry-based teaching methods.

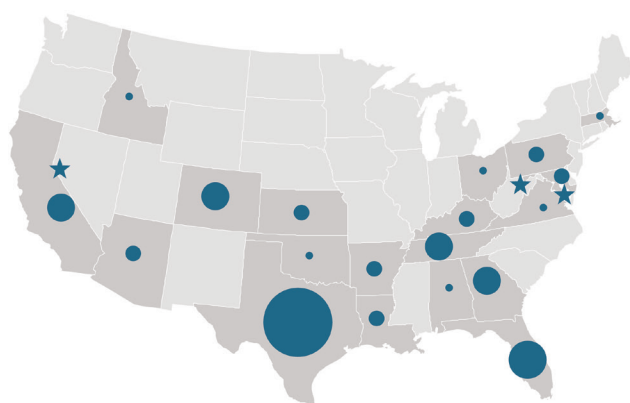

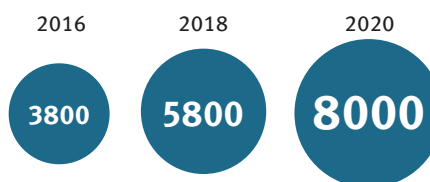
