Soul Food: A Word from Peter

Looking for Evidence

He is the image of the invisible God, the firstborn over all creation. - Colossians 1:15

Many people today reject the idea of God. They demand facts and evidence empirical proof that God exists.

However, they are overlooking one thing. The Christian faith is based on facts. As Christians, we believe the unseen, eternal God entered time, space and history. We believe the infinite God took on human form and became a Jewish carpenter – Jesus of Nazareth.

Jesus was seen by thousands of people. They heard him speak. They touched him. They witnessed his miracles. They saw him walk on water, heal the sick, calm a raging storm and feed 5,000 people with a couple of loaves and fishes. They saw him crucified, dead, and buried – and rise again on Easter morning.

What proof do we have that Jesus existed? The proof is found in the four Gospels, based on the eyewitness testimony of the disciples. The Gospels are filled with empirical data – names, dates and places. In the words of J.B. Philipps, the Gospels have "the ring of truth."

The Christian faith isn't based on mystical visions or philosophical speculation: it is based on facts. If you are looking for evidence that God exists, you will find it in the life of Jesus Christ.


