**#2:** That we scan and copy to a digital device all of the club information we currently have in notebooks. A copy would go to the President, a copy to the committee chair and one copy to be kept in the file at CAP. In addition, a copy of all the club material will be stored on the International website in our club's shared files. There was some discussion. The record retention committee will look into it further. The motion was approved.

Literacy Connection: Beverly Coryell held up a handmade thank you card from the children at Kessler School for the books we donated to the library. We have books for Catlin School but they need to be covered with plastic book covers and entered into the computer system. If a member wants to volunteer at Catlin library, it is open in the morning.

**Backpack Buddies:** Sue Kirk reported that we now deliver 180 bags of food per week. She thanked everyone who helped put the bags together. She also reported that the Emmanuel Lutheran Church sent a check for \$2400.00 for Backpack Buddies. Some LCC students who are getting their GED's will be helping us fill bags as a community service project. We also received canned goods from donations at Burgerville last Thursday.
