



November Monthly Show Judge - Amber George

Biography

Amber George is a painter and printmaker. Living in a rural artist community in northern San Diego County, her property and her surroundings continue to inspire her today, just as being in nature did as a child. Her work is informed by her observations of nature. Whether in her garden or on a sailboat, her eye is keen to search out shapes and patterns in nature.

Growing up in California, she studied art from an early age. She spent her summers around her family in the Midwest, most of whom were raised on farms. Family vacations were spent making crafts, gardening, camping, horseback riding in the Rockies and being outside. She attributes these experiences to her profound love of nature and plants.

Amber George received her BA in Fine Art from UCLA in 1994. She studied with some of the most notable contemporary artists in Los Angeles, including Lari Pittman and Nancy Rubins. In addition to private collections across the US, her work is also included in numerous corporate collections such as Deloitte & Touche, Four Seasons, Kansas City Power and Light and Westin Hotels.

Her work has received additional attention from writers and gallery owners. Her painting Parasol Landscape was featured in the 2008 book <u>Embracing Encaustic</u> written by Linda Womack. She was invited to participate in the San Francisco Museum of Modern Art's Art Auction 2008. In 2011, she curated a show for Susan Eley Fine Art in New York titled Making their Mark, focusing on artists who use mark making as the primary element in painting.

Artist Statement

I paint memories of plants, places or personal items such as clothing and fabrics. Rather than rely on actual documentation of those things, I use manipulated photographs, distorted photocopies and intuitive and interpreted memories. I am attracted to bold shapes, dissected compositions and patterns. The balance between organic and order is a broad theme across my work and informs both structural and subjective decisions. I employ a variety of techniques including painting, printmaking, collage, photography and sculptural manipulation of the encaustic medium to achieve each painting.

My current body of work, the Sewing series, is rooted in a push and pull where I simultaneously embrace and disengage with expectations of traditional roles and ideas. My grandmothers were a huge influence on me creatively as well as philosophically. I spent hours sewing, embroidering, crocheting, knitting and cooking with them. I find this idea of womanhood at times in contrast with the expectations of today. The paintings are a reflection of my attempt to combine the traditional with the more contemporary aspects of life. I create my own "fabric" in the series by using my plant archetypes to create repeating patterns and I use bits and pieces of sewing pattern paper. I also incorporate vintage sewing patterns, doilies and fabric. It's my version of sewing with my own peculiar rules and standards.

Marileigh Schulte is a founding member of the Rancho Sante Fe Artists Guild & Gallery. She is a past member of Market Street Painters and a member of the Printmakers Atelier for the past three years under supervision of Francois Gilot. In addition, she is a member of the San Diego Portrait Society and National Artists Equity. Currently, Marileigh is impresario for Southern California artists and is an angel member of Oil Painters of America.

Marileigh loves the dramatic effects of light, and the use of deep rich colors. She mostly enjoys figurative work in an impressionist style. Much of her work depicts figures because she was introduced to fashion design early in life. For many years, Marileigh was CEO of one of the most prestigious clothing and manufacturing companies in the United States. Years of sketching fashion models and designing fabric helped to expand her artistic abilities.

Her work is displayed with pride in many private collections throughout the United States. Marileigh lives and plays in beautiful Rancho Sante Fe with husband Frank and their dogs, Cosmo, Bella, and Chance.

Marileigh has juried many shows, her latest being the prestigeous five state competition that pulled entries representative of the best of American art. This was followed by a four day workshop on Figure Painting From Photographs. Also, The Texas Regional Art Exhibit that included Texas, Arkansas, Louisana, New Mexico and Oklahoma.

Renting a full wall space allows you to display your works of art near each other, thus attracting attention and facilitating understanding of your art.

To be a wall renter, you need to be accepted by SDAG's art jury, and you need to help staff the gallery once a month and do some additional work for the guild. This is also after you have entered 3 monthly shows in the media that you will want to display as a wall renter. Rent is \$90 per two month rotation, and you must agree to rent for at least four months.

The program "Try It You'll Like It" is a series of visual art workshops giving the community an opportunity to try out a variety of art media taught by skilled artists from our guild. The workshops were held at San Diego Botanic Garden on Thursday, October 6 from 9:30am to 1:30pm. This was the third program of this type offered by SDAG.

Students pre-registered to take two out of nine classes offered. The classes included jewelry taught by Linda Melvin, watercolor taught by Julee Jobe, acrylic on canvas taught by Char Cee Colosia, oil painting taught by Darlene Katz, acrylic taught by Donna Butnik, polymer clay taught by Katie Jablonski, mixed media taught by Kathleen McVey, pastel taught by Joan Grine, and Chinese brush taught by Lisa Curry.

The teachers, all San Dieguito Art Guild members, donated their time. Art supplies, room rental and other expenses were covered by a grant from the City of Encinitas Community Grant Program and the Mizel Foundation. Over 75 students came to the workshops. They ranged from people who had done no art whatsoever, to accomplished artists who wanted to try something new.

Empower the Off Track Gallery Staff to sell YOUR work

Lynn Ely, Yanina Cambareri, Diane Dudek, Cheryl DeLain, Terry Oshrin, Jeffrey R. Brosbe, Paul Richter and I met last Thursday evening explain their work and to give each other the sentences that will help sell their work to our customers.

Sunday when I staffed the gallery I repeated to a customer what Diane Dudek had told me about her paintings. The customer came back later to show his wife the painting that he had admired and had learned a little more about. Even though they may not have purchased the painting that evening, they may be back. The more we, as staff, know about each other's work the better. Some pieces of artwork do "sell themselves" but most of the time the customer needs help with what they are about to purchase. They want the story behind the artwork. They want to be sure that it is a good purchase or investment for them. And I think all of us can admit it does feel pretty good when we do sell.

The next empowering session is on Thursday, November 17, from 6:00pm to 7:00pm at the Off Track Gallery.

Each SDAG member in attendance will be given a few minutes to tell us what is special about their work.

For example:

- * The quality of the materials used
- * The time involved in making the piece
- * Why it is different from other artists' work
- * Your training to produce your artwork
- * Your philosophy
- * Your thought process

In short, whatever your verbage is to your clients to help get your artwork sold. This does not need to be a long presentation. Just a few words to empower your fellow staff to be knowlegeable about your work.

Please do not just email me a description of your work and not show up. This will indeed help others sell YOUR work, but you will not have had the benefit of hearing everyone else's comments on their own work so won't help you sell THEIR work.

Join us for a glass of wine and a munchie as we walk around the gallery learning about each other. A quick RSVP to me would be nice, but please feel free to show up even if you did not remember to RSVP.
