State Law Requires the Following Minimum Doses:

5 DTaP, DTP, DT doses (If 4th dose is after 4th birthday, 5th dose is not required, DT requires medical exemption.)

4 Polio Vaccine doses (If 3rd dose if after 4th birthday, 4th dose is not required).

3 Hepatitis B doses (Children born on or after July 1, 1994 are required to have 3 doses).

2 Measles doses (at least 30 days apart; 1st dose on/after 12 months of age).

1 Mumps dose (on/after 12 months of age).

1 Rubella dose (on/after 12 months of age)

1 Varicella dose (Children born on or after April 1, 2001 without documented history of disease).

Exemptions from the North Carolina Immunization Law require that a statement must be on file at school in student's permanent record. Exemption must meet requirements of the law. Consult the local health department.

It is understood and agreed that tuition and fees are payable monthly in advance, for ten months, beginning with August 1 and concluding on May 1.

The tuition is due the first of the month. A late fee of 1 1/2% of the balance due will be added on the 10th of each month.

It is further agreed that if tuition is not paid by the end of each month, the student may be dismissed until payment-in-full is made.

Student Dress Code

Policy:

The environment of learning is enhanced by a neat and orderly appearance.

Statement of Philosophy:

Increasingly, the most time consuming and frustrating discipline problems in the Christian schools are related to dress. The social standards of a rapidly deteriorating society and increasingly lax dress code in the public arena create a greater contrast between the high standards of a separated Christian community and the world at large.

Our objective is to provide an atmosphere which can help our youth to develop a lifestyle of righteous living, leading to maturity in Christ. Our hope is that this statement may be of help to some beleaguered parents as they set standards for their homes so that while there may be a large contrast between our families and the world there will not be a great contrast between home and school.

Recognizing that fashion and styles will continually change, we desire to follow those fashions which will be pleasing to the Lord Jesus Christ, and which will in no way detract from our testimony before the world. Therefore, our dress will always be modest (not calling attention to our body or body parts for sexual reasons) and will not promote the world system (not advertising by word or picture things worldly or entering into fads which are illogical, ugly, or demeaning). Romans 13:11-14, Philippians 4:8-9, 1 Thess. 5:21-22, 1Timothy 2:9-10, 4:12.

YOUNG MEN:

- Hair must be kept trimmed so that it does not come over the eyebrows, may be worn 1/2 inch over top of ear, may not extend below the bottom of the ear, may not touch the collar when standing. Must be neat and combed. **Extreme hairstyles and hair colors unacceptable.
- 2) Faces must be clean shaven. **High school juniors and seniors** may wear facial hair such as beards, mustaches, or sideburns below the bottom of the ear.
- 3) May not have any visible tattoos.
- 4) May not have any visible piercings. May not wear earrings.
- 5) Make-up and nail polish are not to be worn by boys.
- 6) May not wear heavy jewelry: necklaces or rings.
- 7) Standard CCA shirts in approved colors of evergreen, navy, black, blue, maize, red, white, gray heather, cobalt, pink, French blue, or chamois (Polo, Oxford or Fleece - Like the approved ones in

the Land's End School Catalog) must be worn tucked in. CCA

T-shirts worn on Fridays do not need to be tucked in. No

manufacturer's logo allowed.

Shirts and fleece must have the approved school logo monogrammed on.

8) Pants and shorts must not be frayed, faded, or torn. Pants and shorts must be neatly hemmed. Overall appearance is to be neat, not bulky, or baggy. May not sag pants/shorts or wear them

unreasonably tight. Shorts length should be no more than 2"

above knee for grades 3-12 when kneeling and no more than 3" above knee for grades K-2. Colors approved are navy or khaki.

(Like the approved ones in the Land's End School Catalog)

- 9) A belt is required only if the garment was designed with belt loops. No oversized or extravagant buckles.
- 10) Socks are not required.
- 11) Dress, casual, tennis shoes and sandals with a heel strap may be worn Flip-flops and thongs are not allowed.
- 12) Sweaters and light weight jackets must be plain, solid, one color with no textures or designs. Approved colors of red, white, maize, navy,

and evergreen allowed. (Like the approved ones in the Land's End School Catalog) They may be worn in class and do not have to be monogrammed. <u>NO HOODIES ALLOWED.</u>

YOUNG LADIES:

- 1) Hair must be kept neat and combed. **Extreme hairstyles and hair colors are unacceptable.
- 2) May not have any visible tattoos.
- 3) May not have any visible piercings other than earrings for girls.
- 4) Makeup may not be worn by girls in grades K-6. No heavy or extreme makeup to be worn by girls in grades 7-12. No black nail polish.
- 5) Accessories: May not wear worldly, heavy or excessive jewelry. <u>No</u> <u>Jewelry of any sort (includes earrings) may be worn during</u> <u>athletic practices or games. Penalties incur</u>.
- 6) Standard CCA shirts in approved colors of blue, white, pink, chamois, French blue, cobalt, red, maize, gray heather, black, evergreen, or navy (**polos, oxfords, fleece, and Peter Pan blouses like the**

ones approved in the Land's End School Catalog) must be

tucked in. CCA T-shirts worn on Fridays do not need to be tucked

in. No manufacturer's logo allowed.

Shirts, fleece, and blouses must have the approved school logo monogrammed on them.

7) Pants, slacks, skorts, skirts, jumpers, dresses and shorts must not be frayed, faded, or torn. They must be neatly hemmed and not be tight (our call). The overall appearance is to be neat and not bulky or baggy. May not sag pants or shorts. No low riders, hip huggers, slim fit pants (pencil or skinny), pants made of lycra or polyester blend material, or pants made out denim. No feetless, ankle, calf length leggings. Shorts, jumpers, skorts, dresses or skirts length

should be no more than 2" above knee for grades 3-12 when

kneeling and no more than 3" above knee for grades K-2 when kneeling. Pants, slacks, skorts, and shorts colors approved are navy or khaki. Skirts and jumper approved colors are navy, khaki, and any plaid. Dress approved colors are pink, blue, navy, red,

maize, and evergreen. (Like the approved ones in the Land's

End School Catalog)

8) A belt is required only if the garment was designed with belt loops. No oversized or extravagant buckles.

9) Socks are not required. Girls may wear tights or pantyhose. No leggings.

- Dress, casual, tennis shoes, or sandals with a heel strap may be worn. Flip-flops and thongs are unacceptable. Girls in grades K-6 should not wear heels to school.
- 11) Sweaters and lightweight jackets must be plain, solid, one color with no textures or designs. Approved colors of red, white, maize, navy,

and evergreen allowed. (Like the approved ones in the Land's

End School Catalog.) They may be worn in class and do not have to be monogrammed. ****NO HOODIES ALLOWED****

Uniforms may be purchased at any merchant as long as they are like the approved style and colors in the **Land's End School Catalog. Shirts must be monogrammed. Monogramming is provided through CCA with a \$5.00 per shirt fee or through Land's End with a \$6.00 per shirt fee for Land's End shirts. Only these two approved sources may be used for monogramming to maintain uniformity of the logo.

Approved Land's End shirts and blouses must have the school's logo embroidered on them. The logo number is **0449400K**, and the cost is \$6.00. The Oxford shirts, and the Peter Pan blouses must have the small CCA logo on them. The logo number is **0450495K** and the cost is \$6.00.

Appropriate dress code is expected of all students at all school events including ball games, formal, award ceremonies, graduation, plays, and field trips. Students will be informed ahead of time as to the appropriate dress attire for such events.

FIELD TRIP DRESS CODE:

Christian t-shirts, CCA t-shirts, or tournament t-shirts may be worn. Other shirts with small manufacturer's logo are also permitted. No tank tops or sleeveless

shirts may be worn. Girl's shirts must not be low, tight, see-through, or revealing. Jeans may be worn but cannot be tight, have holes, or be extremely baggy. girls may also wear capris. Flip-flops may be worn.

DRESS-DOWN DAY:

Periodically students will be rewarded with a "dress-down day." Only CCA tshirts, CCA class t-shirts, or tournament t-shirts may be worn with appropriate pants/skirts. Jeans and flip-flops may also be worn.

SPIRIT WEEK DRESS CODE:

Spirit week is an exciting and enjoyable time for CCA students. Students must wear outfits that correspond with the theme of the day and must refrain from anything immodest or inappropriate. Students may not wear jeans and a t-shirt every day or come in sweat pants and sweatshirt every day. They must dress

according to the day's theme or they will be required to change.

FORMAL/HOMECOMING DRESS CODE:

Dresses worn by ladies are to be **modest**. Dresses may be no shorter than two inches above the knee. If long dresses are worn, the slit may be no shorter than two inches above the knee. No strapless or spaghetti straps allowed. Backless or strapless dresses are not permitted (the back must not be lower than the bra line). The front must not be revealing. Tight, form-fitting dresses are not acceptable. Straps must be 2" wide.

All formal dresses must be approved by the female high school faculty. Anyone not adhering to dress code will be asked to comply or leave.

Gentlemen inviting ladies other than CCA students are to inform their dates of the CCA dress code and their dates must bring their dresses in for approval.

GRADUATION AND AWARD CEREMONIES:

Students must adhere to the prescribed dress code for these events. Anyone who does not adhere may be asked to leave.
