Scholarship Opportunities for 4-H Youth

It's scholarship season for high school seniors and there are many opportunities for youth to apply to help support their post-secondary goals.

Milbank Area Chamber of Commerce Agriculture Scholarship

The Milbank Area Chamber of
 Commerce agriculture committee has
 dedicated funds for two \$500

scholarships. The scholarships are open to South Dakota high school seniors who are planning to study agriculture at a post-secondary institute. Applications are available at Titan machinery and Schuneman Equipment in Milbank. Deadline is April 1, 2015.

Daisy/4-H Shooting Sports Scholarship

To be considered for this scholarships,

the student must have participated in 4 -H shooting sports for a minimum of three years, and be either a high school senior or college freshman with a minimum 2.5 GPA. The South Dakota shooting sports program will disburse a minimum of two \$500 scholarships. 2014-2015 4-H Livestock Updates

The 2015 4-H Livestock Ownership Verification Affidavits are available on iGrow. New this year, many columns have an asterisk on them. This denotes that this is required information. If the information is missing for 4HOnline, the form will be considered incomplete. The rabbit and poultry forms will be due June I as well. This is a new requirement from the State 4-H Office.

Families planning on participating at the Northeast Calf Show in Watertown February 14, you will need to pick up an DNA envelope if you are planning to DNA for SD State Fair and a 4-H Green Tag. Due to the new tagging system for next year, counties have limited supply of 4-H Green Tags. Please pick up these items by February 12 at the Grant County 4-H Office.

A new Livestock Lease form will be released at a later date. Youth are able to lease market animals for 2015 4-H year. The only animals that cannot be leased will be market swine as the State Fair show is terminal.

The "Green Tagging" system will be changing, starting with the 2014-2015 4-H program year.

Beginning with the 2015-2016 4-H program year, South Dakota 4-H Youth Development will move to completely different tags. Currently our tags are four numbers with a single letter. In the future, we will use National Unified Ear-Tagging System (NUES) tags. NUES tags are federally required for animals to technically cross state lines.

Another important part of the NUES tagging system is that only one federal tag can be placed in animal. This becomes problematic with sheep and goats that already carry a Scrapie Tag (which is also a federal tag). Because of this, we will move away from green tagging sheep and goats. Sheep and goats still need to be verified on the Ownership Verification Affidavit forms, going forward their Scrapie number is the unique identifier. This change requires the entire Scrapie number be recorded on the form including the state code.

Another "change" for the 2015-2016 4-H program year will be in pre-identification for 4-H Dairy Cattle. Going forward, families will be required to provide one type of ID when submitting forms:

- A registration tag
- A registration tattoo
- An Electronic Identification Device (EID) tag number
- A complete Bangs tag number or a 4-H Green Tag number

To stay consistent, Breeding Beef animals will be required to have something more tangible than a herd tag for commercial animals. Breeding beef will need a tattoo at verification time or a Green Tag.

An email was sent out January 27 to 4-H Families regarding the many Livestock updates from the State 4-H Office. In that email, there was information about the Horse Achievement Program and 4-H Rodeo Packet. Our horse safety dates will be set in February. Those interested in participating in Rodeo, packets are due to the Grant County 4-H Office by April 27th.

2015 4-H Camp

Grant County will be attending camp at Camp Bob Marshall near Custer, SD June 23-26. This year's theme is Way to the West. Youth will enjoy the Black Hills, canoeing, camp fire cooking, leather crafts, and much more. Registration fee is \$45/4-H camper, \$55/non-4-H camper. About Power Project Days

In 2014, the Grant County 4-H office reached out to their 4-H clubs to host a Power Project

Day for youth. In previous years, it was one day to complete few projects. Clubs come up and plan

project ideas. Participants leave with a completed project that can be entered at the Grant County Achievement Days. 4-H members are encouraged to bring a friend to have fun and learn about 4-H.

RULES & REGULATIONS

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- . The show is for 4-H members enrolled in the beef project in Clark, Codington, Day, Deuel, Grant, Hamlin, Kingsbury, Marshall, Roberts, and Spink counties.
- 2. Calves must be born after January 1, 2014 and be the members' 4-H project.
- . The show will be at **2:30 p.m.** on Saturday, February 14. All entries must be weighed in by **noon**. Calves may be brought to the barn **after 4:00 p.m. on Friday the 13**th and taken home following the show.
- 4. Calves will be judged in five classes:

 Class I Heifers British Purebred Class 4 Steers British

Purebred

Class 2 Heifers - Crossbred Class 5 Steers - Crossbred

Class 3 Heifers - Market

Cross 2 Steers - Cross 5 Steers

- Steers will be weighed and placed into classes by number and weight. Heifers will be
 placed in classes according to age. Calves will be weighed and entered from 10:00
 a.m. until noon on Saturday, February 14.
- 6. There is an entry fee of \$10.00 per animal and it must accompany your entry form on the day of the Show. There is no limit on the number of entries a member can have in the show.
- 7. All animals must be halter-broke and able to lead and tie.
- 8. All animals must have a health certificate from a licensed veterinarian within 30 days of the show and must be free of any contagious disease such as warts, ring worm, etc.
- 9. Wood chip base is furnished. No straw allowed.
- 10. A signed Code of Practice form must be returned for each exhibitor.
- 11. Fitting is optional except any grooming material that changes the color, conformation, or appearance of the animal will not be allowed. Violators will be dropped one placing and will not be eligible for premium money. Washing facilities are available. All exhibitors must be with their animal when it is washed, fit, or groomed.
- 12. There will be three showmanship contests: a beginner contest (8-10 year old), a junior contest (11-13 year old) and a senior contest (14 & older). **Showmanship contests will be last.** The senior contest is first.
- 13. Awards: Trophies will be awarded in four classes to the grand champions. Champion showmanship winners will receive a prize donated by Coteau Hills Cattlemen. Entry money, less any show expense, will be paid back according to class placing. Cash awards of \$50.00 awarded to Champion in both British Purebred and Crossbred Steers and Heifers; \$25.00 awarded to the Reserve Champion in those four classes.
- 14. All decisions of the 4-H Calf Show committee, judge and veterinarian are final.

CODE OF PRACTICE

I believe that my participation in the 4-H
Youth Livestock Program should
demonstrate my own ability, knowledge,
and skill as a feeder and fitter of livestock,
i will follow South Dakota 4-H Rules
regarding Animal Preparation (See your
State 4-H Fair Book.)

I will not use abusive or questionable techniques in the feeding, fitting and showing of my animals. I will not resort to fraudulent, illegal, or deceptive practices when fitting them for show. I also will not allow my parents or any other adult to employ such practices to my animal.

I will read and understand the rules of all livestock shows in which I am a participant. I ask that my parents and others working with me on my project animal not break the rules or make exception on my behalf. I wish for my livestock project to be an example of how to accept what life has to offer—good and bad—and how to live with the outcome.

I realize that I am responsible for:

- The proper care and treatment of my animals,
- The production of wholesome food,
 The development of sound moral character in myself and others.

Any violation of the Code of Practice may cause the exhibitor from exhibiting at the show, and future shows, and will lose premiums.
