



Q: Why are we so crazy about the soccer deadline??

A: At the Recreation Department we understand summer is the worst possible time to make a deadline. We are fully aware of the frustration of parents who miss signing their child up for soccer especially if that means late fees or possibly not getting on a team.

So, I wanted to take just a second to explain to you why we have such a firm date. Once we find out how many children we have participating in the program, we divide the kids into teams that allow for your child to have the maximum amount of play time. In a nutshell we want you to get your money's worth and a positive experience for your child. There is nothing worse for you or your child than only getting to play a small portion of the game because the teams were over-filled. Once we know how many teams we have, we work to build a game schedule with the other towns.

OK, ready for it... here comes the tricky part. If, after the deadline, we get an onslaught of late ad-ons, our only option is to add them to existing teams. As you can imagine, we would get a lot of angry emails if a child is on a team of 30 kids. So, we do need to close teams when the number of kids reach 12.

Now that you know the process, you get to choose to roll the dice and hope for open spots after the deadline and get to pay the complementary \$10 late fee or register before the deadline ensuring a spot on the team.

After that is completed, a true calculation for the about of top soil needed can be determined. We look forward to the day when we can use the new fields. Thank you for your continued support!



The Town of Northwood has three public beaches open to residents. Beaches are open from Memorial Day weekend through Labor Day weekend.

Mary Waldron Beach: Located at 416 Bow Lake Rd.

Amenities: handicap accessible portable bathroom, raft, picnic tables, sandy beach, boat launch Bennett's Bridge Beach: Located at 61 Bennett Bridge Rd

Northwood Lake Beach: Located on 57 Lake Shore Dr.

Amenities: handicap accessible portable bathroom, picnic tables, wheel chair accessible picnic table, sandy beach,

Water Status

Water is tested and monitored by the Health Officer. When elevated levels of E.coli bacteria are present, notices will be posted at the entrance to the waterfront.

Lifeguards

The Recreation Department staffs the beaches with lifeguards as scheduling permits.

Upon arrival at the beach take notice of sign indicating if the lifeguard is on duty as well as the location of the lifeguard on duty. Lifeguards employed by the Town will always be dressed in a uniform that clearly identifies the individual as a lifeguard using the universal "GUARD" marking.

Resident Pass

All Northwood property owners/renters are required to obtain a Transfer Station Pass which also serves at Beach Pass. There are no fees for Northwood residents to use the beaches.
