## Sixth form -BYOD Policy

## General information

Access to the wireless network with any device is filtered. Access from a personal device is limited to Internet use, including access to N, O and Q drives via Moodle. Access to the wireless network is a privilege, not a right and access to the network involves personal responsibility and compliance with all school rules, including the QEGS Acceptable Use Policy. The use of the network allows IT staff to conduct investigations regarding inappropriate Internet use at any time, by teacher request or for other reasons deemed appropriate by the school.

## **Guidelines for Use**

- Use of personal devices during the school day is at the discretion of staff. Students must use devices as directed by their teacher.
- The primary purpose of the use of personal devices at school is educational.
- The use of a personal device is not to be a distraction in any way to teachers or students. Personal devices must not disrupt a class in any way.
- Students will not attempt to circumvent the school's network security and /or filtering policies.

Consequences for Misuse/Disruption (one or more may apply):

- Access to the wireless network will be removed.
- The student will not be allowed to use personal devices at school.
- Serious misuse of Internet capable devices is regarded as a serious offence within the School's Behaviour Policy and will be dealt with in accordance with this policy.

## **School Liability Statement**

Students bring their devices to use at Queen Elizabeth's Grammar School, Horncastle at their own risk. Students are expected to act responsibly with regards to their own device, keeping it up to date and as secure as possible. It is their duty to be responsible for the upkeep and protection of their devices. The school cannot guarantee the compatibility of all devices with the school network.
