Our first two meetings of 2008 were very different but both extremely enjoyable. In January Janice Baldry gave us an artistic start to the year with a delightfully inspiring demonstration in the art of making sugar flowers. We watched her turn small balls of sugar paste into beautiful delicate flowers. It was very interesting to see how she worked and shaped the sugar until it was petal thin and then brought the flowers to life with a few very simple moves. This is obviously a craft for the deft of hand among us!

At our February meeting we once again welcomed Mark Mitchels and this time his talk was on Mozart. He told us how Mozart's father was a professional musician and how from a young age Mozart would insist on having music played whilst he played with his toys. His family toured Europe and gradually Mozart's reputation as a protégé became apparent – he was only 8 year of age when he composed his first symphony. During the tours he was presented at court to a number of royal palaces in Europe and he also visited London. Sadly Mozart died at the age of 35, but amazingly, in that short time, he composed 700 pieces of music. It was a truly spellbinding narrative which was brought to life by accompanying slides and music.

A note for your diaries is our Coffee Morning which is being held on 10th May at the White Hart, Saxmundham. All will be made very welcome and entrance is free. Stalls will include a raffle, bric-a-brac and cakes. Refreshments will be available.

#### Saxmundham in Bloom

The Saxmundham in Bloom Team have already started to raise funds and make plans for our entry into the 2008 Anglia in Bloom competition, and the beady-eved amongst you may have noticed a few new additions to the flora of the Town. A number of ceramic butler sinks have been placed at four of the entrances to Saxmundham - North and South Entrances. Saxmundham Road on the way in from Leiston, and at the top of Rendham Road, by the A12. These have been purchased using kind donations made by residents of the Town, and have been planted up for the winter with a colourful selection of pansies and stocks. The plants will need to be replaced as the seasons change, and then maintained and watered throughout the year, so the Saxmundham in Bloom (SIB) Team will be looking for people to sponsor these sinks on an annual basis, at a cost of £30 per sink. In a further attempt to brighten up the entrances to the Town, the team spent a cold and blustery Sunday morning, planting 250 spring bulbs in the grassy area at the top of Rendham Road – again purchased using a donation from a generous supporter. The SIB Team now has two dedicated fundraisers, and have already had a stall at the Saxmundham Horticultural Society Show in November, where they sold calendars, postcards (which can still be purchased at Crisps!), fridge magnets, crocheted turtles and flowers, and ran a very popular game involving sticks and sand! This was a great success, not only for fundraising, but also for raising awareness of Saxmundham in Bloom, and how it all happens! We also hosted a Wine Tasting Evening in the Market Hall, which was thoroughly enjoyed by all, and plans are already afoot for the next one! Not stopping there, we are also planning on having a stall in Fromus Square at the St. George's Day Celebrations on Saturday 19th April. Once again, we are hoping for another fabulous display of hanging baskets in the summer, and these can be sponsored by anyone for £27 per basket, which includes its maintenance - what a bargain! Why not get a group together - friends, neighbours, work colleagues - and collectively sponsor a sink or a basket in the Town? Also, did you know that all gardens in Saxmundham are judged during late July, and winners are chosen from four categories: Best Large & Small Front Garden, Best Drought Garden, and Best Hanging Baskets. Winners are invited to attend the presentation of the cups at the Town Council Meeting in October. Why not make an extra special effort and win one of those cups!

#### SAXMUNDHAM MUSEUM

The Museum is now open for the 2008 season. The change of opening times last year was so successful that we are keeping to those times this year, namely Monday to Saturday, 10am until 1pm. Closed Sundays with the exception of Sunday 20th April when we will be open for St George's Weekend celebrations. We will, of course, be open during the Arts Festival Week.

There have been no major changes during the closed season, a lot of clearing and cleaning. Many more photographs of Saxmundham and local villages have been put on the touch screen. We are also hoping to obtain another film to run in the cinema. One of our main aims at present is to become an Accredited Museum. This will take at least two years, and several members of a small sub-committee, will be having training and working hard to obtain this. It will mean that we will be recognised by other Accredited Museums and, of course, it will bring many benefits to us among which we will be able to obtain grants for projects we wish to carry forward. We will also be able to loan and borrow artefacts from other Museums to fit in with any theme we are going to display. We are, of course, looking for new Friends of the Museum, and if you are interested please do ask one of the Stewards for a form. The Museum is maintained from subscriptions and donations and without your help we just would not be able to exist. Saxmundham entered the 'Anglia in Bloom' competition again last year, after missing a year in 2006, and we are pleased to say that our efforts were recognised with a Silver Award in the 'Small Town' category. With the help and support of the residents of Saxmundham. we are striving to achieve bigger and better things, and hopefully our second win with our 2008 entry. The display of hanging baskets in the High Street and elsewhere in the Town have always been very impressive, and we hope that this may continue next year. The cost of safely hanging each 18 inch basket continues to be £27, which covers the cost of everything, including the regular watering, grooming and replacement if necessary, for the whole summer, to the end of September. Weather permitting, the baskets usually go up during the first weekend in June, and are taken down at the beginning of October.
