Student Application and Registration

There is a crisis in the ethnic minority community in Connecticut. There is a shortage of mental health providers of color, especially psychologists to serve the increasing ethnic minority population. It is critical that the unique needs of clients from various ethnicities and cultures be addressed by ensuring future mental health providers who are culturally competent.

It is important that students of color who are interested in entering the mental health field are recruited, mentored and retained in the field of psychology. The Ethnic Diversity Task Force Scholarship is an opportunity for students of color to be inspired by being exposed to psychologists with various expertise and backgrounds.

ETHNIC DIVERSITY TASK FORCE (EDTF)

EDTF of the Connecticut Psychological Association (CPA) was formed in January 2001. EDTF is a group of ethnically and racially diverse professionals and students who promote and advocate for culturally competent services and mental health in communities of color, and support the recruitment and retention of ethnically diverse students and professionals in the field of psychology through networking and mentorship.

MENTORING AND SCHOLARSHIP BENEFITS

November 2012 marks the eleventh annual mentoring opportunity for high school students, undergraduate and graduate psychology students of color in Connecticut. Once again, the EDTF will provide scholarships to student applicants on a first come first serve basis. Student registrants will benefit by being:
