Did You Know?

- -Historically Black Colleges and Universities (HBCUs), "a vital part of our Nation's higher education system," (President Bush, 2002) are institutions of higher education established prior to 1964 with the ongoing mission of educating African-American students
- -HBCUs comprise only 3% of the nation's two and four-year institutions yet are responsible for producing 28% of all bachelor's degrees, 15% of all master's degrees, and 17% of all first professional degrees earned by African-Americans
- -In 2011, the federal government limited the number of semesters for students to use Pell Grants from 18 to 12 semesters. The change was significant for the following reasons: HBCU students generally take longer on average to graduate, approximately six years; approximately 85% of HBCU students rely on Pell Grants to fund their education; and, in turn, HBCUs lost tuition revenue because students could not afford to keep attending
- -HBCUs tend not to have robust endowments funds to offer scholarships and financial support to its students
- -Limited financial aid resources tend to scare people away from attending an HBCU
- -HBCUs do offer its students an environment rich in history and examples of scholars, inventors and Philanthropists with whom their students can identify.
- -Students attending community colleges in California are guaranteed admission into 9 HBCUs: Bennett College, Dillard University, Fisk University, Lincoln University of Missouri, Philander Smith College, Stillman College, Talladega College, Tuskegee University and Wiley College
- -Founder/Executive Director, Whitney Alston, graduated from an HBCU, Howard University, in 2010
- -Jerome Alston, for whom the Foundation is named, graduated from an HBCU, Virginia State University in 1988
