Dear 4-H Families & Friends:

We are already halfway through the 4-H year, and we are certain there is great learning and growth occurring in your project work. We are grateful that we can support you in your projects and are excited to see what you have learned. We want to remind you that you must be enrolled in your projects by **April 1st** in <u>4HOnline</u> to be able to show them at the 2016 La Crosse Interstate Fair. Please contact us if you need any assistance enrolling or re-enrolling.

As you may have heard, there are changes ahead for UW-Extension. The decision to cut \$250 million from the UW System budget had a direct impact on Cooperative Extension and local Extension programs. As a result of the reorganization, Cooperative Extension will look and respond differently than it has in the past, as the changes mean we will be doing "less with less." At this time, we are uncertain how our county office and staff will be specifically impacted. The plan, referred to as "the *nEXT Generation* Priorities", includes:

- ◆ Implementation of a multi-county area structure that provides shared administrative leadership for each two-to-five county area. La Crosse County has been grouped with Crawford, Monroe, Richland, and Vernon counties.
- ◆ Retaining a local presence with a Cooperative Extension office in each of the existing county and tribal offices

Dog Obedience & Agility

There will be an orientation class on Thursday, April 14th at 6:00 p.m. to be held at the West Salem Library Community Room. All dog project members who will be showing at the fair for Obedience, Showmanship, Agility, or critter hunt are required to attend this meeting with a parent. Please DO NOT bring your dog to this meeting!

Dog obedience, showmanship, agility, critter hunt, and dog bowl classes are open to all 4-H members in grades 3 and up. To register, please fill out the form located at http://lacrosse.uwex.edu/4-h-youth-development/.

Send the form, a copy of your dog's shot records (or a purchase receipt if you administer your own) to the La Crosse County UW-Extension office by **Friday, April 1st**. Please make checks payable to the La Crosse County 4-H Dog Project. After April 1st, there will be a \$20/youth late fee. No one may register after 4:30 p.m. April 8th.

NO REGISTRATION = NO PARTICIPATION! NOTE: This does not enroll you in the dog project; you still need to enroll in the dog project by **April 1st** to show at the La Crosse Interstate Fair.

Registration fees for 4-H youth are as follows:

- Obedience/Showmanship: \$15 per student
- Agility: \$10 per student
- Critter Hunt: \$5 per student

There will be a **maximum registration fee of \$25 per 4-H student and \$50 per 4-H family**. Non 4-H community youth registration fees are \$50 per student/per class.

All classes will meet in the **Farm Progress Building** at the fairgrounds. **The dog training classes are as follows:**

- Dog Obedience/Showmanship classes will meet every Thursday until fair beginning April 21st. Beginners classes will start at 6:00 p.m. (1st and 2nd year students); Advanced classes (3rd year and up) will start at 7:15 p.m.
- <u>Dog Agility classes</u> will meet every Tuesday until fair beginning on April 26th. Beginner's class (1st year students) will start at 6:00 p.m.; Advanced class (2nd year and up) will start at 7:00 p.m.
- <u>Critter Hunt classes</u> will meet every Tuesday until fair beginning on May 3rd. This class will meet following Advanced Agility class. (Time may vary slightly week to week).

2016 State Fair Market Animal Identification

Youth interested in showing market beef, sheep, or swine at the 2016 Wisconsin State Fair will need to have their animal projects DNA/RFID identified through the Wisconsin Livestock Identification Consortium (WLIC) by the respective eligibility deadlines:

Sheep May 10th, 2016

• Swine May 10th, 2016

Swine Weigh-In

2016 County Fair Swine weigh-in update (protocol will be similar to last year):

- All pigs must be self-identified with either a
 La Crosse Interstate Fair ear tag or a Wisconsin
 State Fair ear tag by April 18th. The tag should be
 placed in the right ear of each pig.
- A triplicate form for animal identification must be completed and returned to the UW-Extension office by April 18th. Forms must include the exhibitor(s) name, current grade, parent name, and phone number, as well as each pig's tag number, ear notches, gender, and a detailed description. Forms must also be signed and dated.
- La Crosse County tags and triplicate identification forms will be available in March at the UW-Extension office. State fair tags will be handled through the Wisconsin State Fair as in the past (http://wistatefair.com/competitions/junior-livestock/).

*The swine show at the county fair will NOT be terminal unless otherwise mandated.

Spring Trap Shooting Program

Want to learn how to trap shoot in a safe and fun environment? La Crosse County 4-H is offering a trap shooting program for youth ages 12 and up. The program runs Monday, April 25th - Monday, May 23rd at 6:00 p.m. at the Gunslick Gun Club located on Briggs Road in Holmen. Participants must be at least 12 years of age and have a Hunter's Safety Certificate. Youth do not need to be in 4-H to participate in this program.

The fee include five sessions for the cost of \$25 (\$40 for community members), as well as:

- Safety Instruction
- Insurance
- Ear protection
- Use of shotguns (if needed)
- Clay pigeons
- All ammunition
- Use of facility



Growing up in rural Crawford County, I had the privilege of being part of a 4-H club. It was an active club that allowed us to explore our interests in a safe and fun environment. I learned a lot through my years in 4-H; it was the first place I ever gave a speech in front of an audience! From that moment on, I was hooked. That moment guided me toward my career in communication and radio. I am an example of how 4-H shapes kids' lives in positive ways.

My son, Lucas, is also a perfect example. A chance encounter with Sue Pittman at a trade show led him into the Horseless Horse project with her daughter, Angie, and Jess Ahnen. He was a bit nervous when we went to Dave and JoAnn Nyhus' farm for the first time, but that all changed when he met a horse named Buster ... who became a lifelong friend. Lucas was a kid who was facing bullies at school and really didn't have an outlet to call his own. He found that outlet through horses and 4-H.

After high school, Lucas attended an equine academy in West Virginia for two years and is now the head horse trainer at a ranch in Texas.
