Prevention Works! *A Community Coalition of Clallam County* (PW!) is bringing The Grantsmanship Center's nationally recognized 5-day training program for grantseekers to Port Angeles, April 21 - 25, 2014. The Center has provided quality training for novice and experienced grant writers for over 40 years. Participants in this workshop will research funding sources, prepare real grant proposals, and learn to review them as funders do. Attendees will leave the workshop with a completed proposal and with a network of others in the community who share an interest in acquiring grants to address local projects.

PW! Board is bringing this opportunity to Clallam County as part of the PW! 5 Year Prevention Plan. As an incentive, PW! is deeply subsidizing tuition costs for Clallam County residents who apply and are selected to attend. To be selected, individuals need to be committed to the entire week of training (a VERY full five days), concerned about community problems, pay the **discounted** tuition fee of \$550 (full tuition is \$895). They also should be willing, if needed, to collaborate on potential grant proposal for community-wide needs that may arise in the next year. Participants must provide their own laptop computer with wi-fi capacity to link to the connection provided on site. Lunches will be *on your own* with snacks and beverages provided twice each day.

Applications must be postmarked no later than March 14 and include a check or Purchase Order. Only 21 slots are available. Acceptance will be based on providing the opportunity to a broad cross-section of the community. **Applicants will be notified of acceptance on March 20th.** Any applicant not selected will receive a 100% refund. "We anticipate a strong positive response," said Norma Turner, PW! Board Chairwoman; "The word from people who keep community efforts strong is that this is a needed opportunity to better train local agency staff and non-profit volunteers to seek and secure additional funding of local projects."

Priority will be given to Clallam County applicants. After local applicants are selected, any open slots will be offered to applicants from outside the County, for the full \$895 tuition. Given the deep discount
