OPEN ENROLLMENT-PART D 2015

Beginning on October 15th through December 7th everyone with Medicare can view the new Medicare approved insurance plans that will offer coverage for prescriptions for the year 2015. Each year new plans become available which might provide a better cost savings for the consumer. If you are currently enrolled in a specific plan, this is a good time to review the premium, deductible, and co-payments. The tier of the drug may also change which means that you could be paying a lesser or higher amount for your current drug plan. Some plans work with specific pharmacies which are called "preferred" pharmacies while other plans may only offer network pharmacies. In any case, it is advantageous to check different pharmacies to compare the cost of your medications.

If you would like to compare the new drug plans, please visit the Medicare website at www.Medicare.gov or contact the senior department for an appointment. If you choose a new plan, benefits will begin on January 1, 2015.

MEDICARE MEDICAID ALIGNMENT INITIATIVE

The Medicare-Medicaid Alignment Initiative is for seniors and persons with disabilities who are enrolled in both Medicare and Medicaid. This program covers all your Medicare and Medicaid benefits, including prescription drug benefits/Medicare Part D.

When you enroll, you can choose a primary care provider (PCP) who will give you information to help you stay healthy, and make referrals. All plans have a choice of doctors, specialists and hospitals. One health plan will cover all your healthcare needs! Care coordinators will assist you in reaching your health goals. Inquire about your options in choosing the right plan; If you do not choose, a plan will be assigned for you. You may also choose to opt out completely from the Managed Care Initiative and stay with your current Medicare/Medicaid coverage.

SCAM

The Better Business Bureau issued a warning highlighting an email scam designed to trick recipients into divulging personal information, including names, addresses and Social Security numbers.

The scheme involves an email from an account impersonating the Social Security Administration, Service Canada or an organization claiming to represent a government agency. The email says you qualify for a new benefit, and to claim it, you need to fill out a form, which asks for a variety of details, such as your name, address, phone number, Social Security number, employer and driver's license or government ID number. Upon completing the form, you receive a confirmation email, which says you'll hear from a government representative soon.

AARP TAX-AIDE ASSISTANCE

Volunteer AARP tax-aide preparers will again offer free income tax filing for disabled and/or senior residents who reside within our township. As the new year begins, you will receive important tax documents such as social security, pension, IRA, W-2, interest and dividend statements. Keep all of these documents for filing. Appointments are required. No walk-ins!

FYI (Smoke/carbon monoxide alarm recall)

The Hoffman Estates Fire Department received notice of a smoke detector and carbon monoxide detector product recall.

Kidde and the U.S. Consumer Product Safety Commission (CPSC) announced a voluntary recall to replace certain Kidde AC/DC smoke alarms and combination smoke/carbon monoxide alarms.

This replacement program was initiated because the units may not perform as designed following a power outage. It involves Kidde residential smoke alarms with model number i12010S manufactured between Dec. 18, 2013 and May 13, 2014, and combination smoke/CO alarms with model number i12010SCO manufactured between Dec. 30, 2013 and May 13, 2014 and model number KN-COSM-IBA manufactured between Oct. 22, 2013 and May 13, 2014.

MEDICARE REMINDER

How Medicare covers vaccines depends on the type of vaccine and the reason it is prescribed. Medicare Part B (either through Original Medicare or a Medicare Advantage plan) covers vaccines after you are exposed to a dangerous virus or disease. For example, it will cover tetanus shots after you step on a rusty nail. It also covers three vaccines under the preventive care benefit—flu, pneumonia, and hepatitis B. All other vaccines should be covered by your Part D prescription drug plan. Every Part D plan must have all commercially available vaccines on its list of covered drugs (formulary), but costs may differ.
