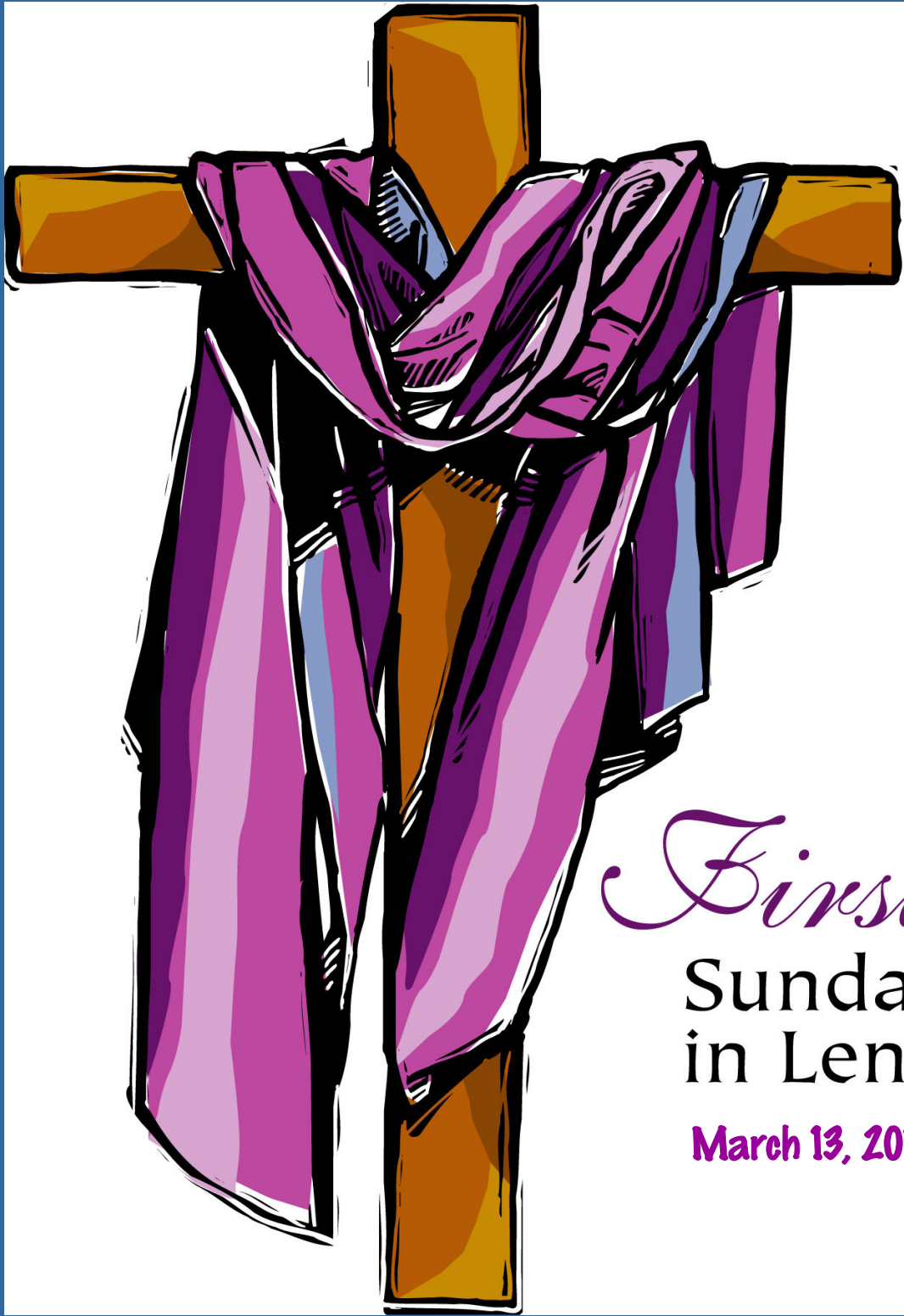

Fast, Abstinence & Other Acts of Penance for Lent



►The Bishops of the United States prescribe, as a minimal obligation, that all people who are fourteen years of age and older are bound to abstain from eating meat on Ash Wednesday and on all the Fridays of Lent. Further, all people eighteen years of age and older, up to and including their fifty-ninth birthday, are bound to fast by limiting themselves to a single full meal on Ash Wednesday and on Good Friday, while the other two meals on those days are to be light.

►All the faithful are encouraged to participate in Mass and to receive the Most Holy Eucharist daily, to celebrate frequently the Sacrament of Penance, to undertake spiritual reading, especially the study of the Sacred Scriptures, and to participate in parish Lenten devotions as well as Lenten education programs. Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament is especially recommended.

►All are encouraged to participate in "Operation Rice Bowl," which has aided countless hungry people here in the Archdiocese as well as throughout our nation and our world.

Deacon Candidate to Become Acolyte

Michael Pascarella, a parishioner and candidate for the permanent diaconate, will be formally instituted into the Ministry of Acolyte on Saturday, Mar. 19, at 10:30 a.m. Mass at St. Charles Borromeo Seminary. All parishioners are cordially invited to attend.

Ministry of Acolyte

An instituted acolyte is appointed by the Church to aid the deacon and minister to the priest at the altar during liturgical celebrations, including the celebration of Mass.

The acolyte distributes Holy Communion as an extraordinary minister and purifies sacred vessels; also, in the true absence of a priest or deacon, to expose the Blessed Sacrament for adoration by the faithful, and afterward repose it, but without the blessing.

The acolyte also instructs temporary acolytes who have been appointed to assist the priest or deacon in liturgical celebrations by carrying the missal, cross, and candles.

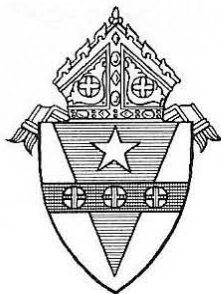

To register in the parish, arrange for a baptism, or request a Certificate of Eligibility for sponsorship at baptism or confirmation, you may contact the rectory. You may come in person to the rectory to meet with one of the deacons on any Sunday of the month after the 9:30 a.m. or 11:30 a.m. Masses. Also, please advise our office of any change of address, telephone number or family status.

Baptism

Baptisms are celebrated every Sunday after the 11:30 a.m. Mass, except on the fifth Sunday of the month when Baptism is celebrated during the 11:30 a.m. Mass. Both parents must attend a Pre-Jordan class, which is held the first Wednesday of every month. Pre-Registration for the class is required by coming to the Rectory office after the 9:30 a.m. or 11:30 a.m. Masses on any Sunday and seeing a Priest or Deacon. Sponsors are required to obtain a letter from their church stating they are members in good standing.

Marriage

Notify the Priest of your intention to marry at least six months before the date of the wedding to assure sufficient preparation and to arrange for Pre-Cana instruction and Natural Family Planning sessions. Pre-Cana Days are held in April and October.

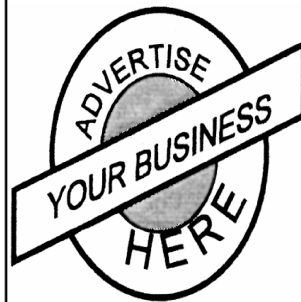

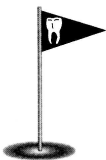


