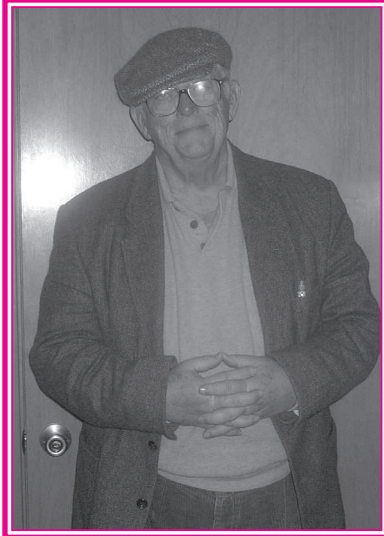

I CAN MAKE A DIFFERENCE

A happy, healthy and prosperous New Year - 2006! With the holiday season barely behind us, we embark on the exciting journey with which the New Year presents us. During the cold, dark days of January many of us, myself included, compose a list. This year, we tell ourselves, is going to be different! Often called resolutions, my "to do" list typically reflects some change from year to year, but the big ones – eat healthier, exercise a little more often and lose a few pounds, well, they always seem to make that list!

You might think that the bigger the resolution, the more likely you are to stick with it until you achieve that goal, like eating in a healthier way. But oddly enough, I find that the resolutions that seem the smallest are the easiest ones to keep. Perhaps that is true because the smaller goals are really the most important. While I would like to lose a few pounds, I find it easier to successfully incorporate other resolutions into my life. For example, last year one resolution I made (and am still trying to keep!) was to be more patient with salesclerks all year long, not just during the Christmas rush. So I decided I would smile and strike up a "I don't know how you do it, but thank you," conversation each time I checked out of a store. Now, I don't know how many people before or after me smiled at the clerks, let alone spoke. I don't know if my minute lessened their stressful day even a little. But I do know that when it was my turn at the cash register, the clerk was kind and patient, not tired and short. In fact, I can report that not one time this entire year have I found an irritable, bad tempered clerk ringing up my purchases.

Isn't it amazing what a word of encouragement can do? Words are supremely powerful both in positive and negative ways. They make all the difference sometimes between success and failure. Look at Share Foundation's residents and campers. There are any number of terms beyond the Sharing Meadows facilities used to "describe" our residents and campers. But those terms are not descriptive; they are limiting. They negatively label and minimize the accomplishments of this very special group we work with. Have you ever wondered why you don't really see other-abled adults who participate in the Share Foundation's programs as other-abled? Maybe it is because they don't see themselves as much different from you or me. They don't see themselves as limited. Perhaps that goes back to not using words that are just plain ugly to the people on the receiving end of those words.

One way you can make a difference this year is to choose your words carefully; no matter to whom you are speaking. Use the term other-abled and only that. Check into an organization, like the Share Foundation, that you would like to learn more about. Come and visit us. Check out the fantastic crafts made by our residents. Compliment them on their handiwork. Everyone appreciates a good word! You don't have to have a lot of time, or a lot of money to make a difference. Smile; wave hello, a simple "you did a good job," or "thank you," require so little effort. Yet these gestures elicit an immediate response, the memory of which far outlasts the initial word. Make a difference, one smile or "hello" at a time. It's a New Year . . . the perfect time to make and keep those resolutions that mean the most!

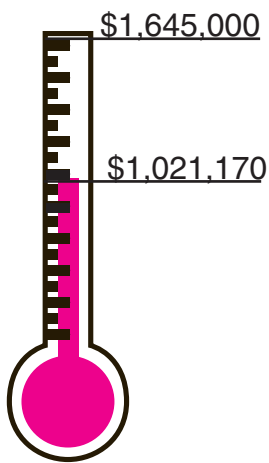
