

Dress Code





The dress code/uniform issue has been a topic of discussion for many years. People on both sides of the issue share strong and emotional opinions about the matter. Some opinions are based on facts, other times they are coming from more human and emotional places. There are valid points to be made for both sides of the discussion. It is safe to say that all of the families in our school want what's best for KCSS. It's also important to find some balance between the needs of the school, and the needs of the students and families. So how do we move forward?

Initial feedback was provided to the Board of Trustees by over one quarter of our families. Thank you! All of the feedback was helpful and seriously considered. The committee had long discussions over the issues and tried to make decisions based on our Catholic values, and concrete, logical facts. We feel we have done just that. As we proceed, we hope that all families will understand that this process is being handled prayerfully, and with the utmost respect for all.

There were many reasons made in support of a stricter dress code or uniform, and three main concerns against it - individuality, cost and elitism (listed in the Dec. 3rd newsletter). All of the concerns and benefits deserved discussion. A request was put out to create a committee to look at both sides of the issue, and come to some agreement on how to move ahead. People joined the committee for varying reasons, and individuals from both sides of the issue were present.

A plan was created and is shared with you on the following pages. The committee and the Board of Trustees feel it is pertinent that the reasons behind the proposal be shared, as well as the plan itself. Please take a moment to prayerfully read over and consider the information.

We hope to receive feedback from the vast majority of families

so we can finalize all details and therefore allow families to plan ahead for the coming year(s).

Your feedback will determine how we move forward,

so the more people that respond, the more information we'll have to work with.

As we considered modifying the dress code vs. moving to a full uniform, we had to identify the validity behind such a discussion, and not be moved by emotion or personal preference. The following points were part of the committee's discussion:

- Modesty, simplicity, ease of enforcement and keeping our Catholic values should be our main priorities.
- We must be sensitive to the concerns of all families, while remaining true to our Catholic values.
 - Whatever decision is made, it must be based on valid, logical reasoning, and always stem from our Catholic faith.
 - The "why" behind our choices must be communicated clearly and thoughtfully.
- Our choices should minimize gray areas and be as concrete as possible so students and parents easily understand and our teachers do not need to spend time enforcing the dress code.
- Choosing a modest and simple dress code is one way to defend the dignity and self-confidence of our students.
- Take the focus off outward appearances and give the clear message to concentrate on the deeper beauty and goodness in others.
- Reinforce that each student's identity and worth should not be based on their clothing choices (or lack thereof), but instead on their personality, actions, words, talents, interests, etc.
- Students won't be distinguished by their socioeconomic level or "fashion sense".
- We would like to create a tidy, more put together look across the student body.
- Comfort and practicality should be considered within the bounds of the higher priorities.
- Our identity as a Catholic classical school is reinforced by a more consistent dress code or uniform.
- Financial and time concerns need to be forefront in our minds, behind our main priorities (listed above).
 - All clothing choices should be inexpensive, easy to find, and readily available.
 - Research was done by committee members and all color choices and styles can be found at local and online stores, within all price ranges (sometimes as low as \$3 on sale, not to mention resale).
 - Families with children who have worn uniforms have found it to be very cost effective and easy to implement.

- As time passed, costs could continue to go down, as clothing exchanges and sales could be scheduled at the end of the school year and again at orientation day. Clothing could also be available on an on-going basis.
 - As students graduated or grew out of clothes, they could be handed down to younger students, or given to the school to sell as a fundraiser (or provided to families at no cost if appropriate).
 - Other schools have had much success with these expense reduction tactics, and they would be simple to implement.
- School pride tends to increase as a result of a more coherent identity.
 - Clothing choices definitely send a message, and we need to decide what message we want to send.
 - A more consistent dress code communicates a sense of purpose, dignity and respect.
 - It may also send the message that our students follow rules and can help students feel a part of something bigger than themselves.
- We should always strive to set higher expectations, raise the bar.
- If outside individuals can identify our students more readily, this also helps market our school.
 - It has been shown that if students can be identified as being tied to a certain school or organization, it also increases positive behavior inside and outside of school.
- Makes mornings easier by not having to think about clothing choices.
- Make sure choices are appropriate for all ages and body types.
- Don't create limitations unless they are in line with our priorities.

The dress code/uniform committee has done the legwork (after long hours of discussion) to work through the details that will reflect our school's values and mission. We've done this with prayerfulness, respect and open hearts. Hopefully the reasons presented will help everyone understand the rationale behind our decisions. Our plan is attached. You may notice that a transition year is included in the plan, with the goal year to begin in the 2017-18 school year. The committee felt that further feedback from families would be valuable.

We urge all families to provide feedback, comments, etc, so we can move forward with a better understanding.

Dress Code Guidelines for Goal Year

(2017-18, after one year of transition)

Tops and Bottoms:

- Solids only, no embellishments
- All clothing choices should be modest.

Tops:

- Dark Purple, white, gray, black, cream/off-white
- <u>Shirts</u>:
 - Polos (short and long sleeve), all collared shirts that button down, crew neck dress shirts (no scoop neck), turtlenecks, mock turtlenecks, v-necks only with crew necks or collared shirt underneath
 - Shirts need not be tucked, but cannot hang down below the hip
 - Plain tops without name brand logos are preferred, but small emblems are permitted if can be covered with two fingers (approx. 1 in)
 - No inappropriate logos (related to alcohol, tobacco, etc.)
- Sweaters, cardigans, fleece, vests within the color scheme
- No sweatshirts except for on KCSS spirit days or dress down days
- <u>Ties and blazers</u> allowed. Ties should be solid or simple pattern. Blazers should fall within the color scheme.
- <u>Dresses</u>:
 - Solid color and fall within the color scheme.
 - Neckline: crew neck or collared
 - Hemline: to the top of the knee or lower

Bottoms (for transition year and goal):

- Black, Khaki, Gray, Navy (includes pants, shorts, skirts, skorts and jumpers)
- Pants:
 - Needs to fit at the waist, no holes or tears, finished hem, appropriate length, no skinny fit or tight pants (easy test for tightness: a marble should be able to roll to the bottom between your leg and pant without stopping)
 - No skinny fit, sweatpants, denim, jeggings, flannel, pajama pants or leggings (leggings okay when worn under a skirt or jumper)
 - Capris for girls only during warmer months (using current dress code dates, with exceptions made by headmaster for on-going warm weather)

• <u>Skirts/Skorts/Jumpers/Shorts</u>:

- Length: Top of knee or lower
- Solid color within color scheme for bottoms (black, khaki, gray or navy)
- When wearing skirts, etc:
 - Wear tights, nylons, leggings, knee high socks during colder months.
 - Ankle socks or no see/no show socks okay in warmer months.
 - Tights, etc should be solid color: white, cream, navy, gray, flesh/tan or black
- \circ No athletic shorts.
 - It is recommended (but not necessary) to wear shorts under regular skirts/jumpers/dresses when not wearing leggings (especially in the younger grades). Any type short is okay under skirts (etc), but should not show.

Footwear:

Current dress code guidelines

Socks/Tights:

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- o Socks: any solid color when wearing pants. When socks show (with shorts, skirts, etc.), refer to colors for tights.
- o Tights: when worn with a dress, skirt, jumper solid color: white, cream, navy, gray, flesh/tan or black

Hair/Jewelry/Accessories:

- Current guidelines
- No earrings for boys

Sport Team Wear:

 \circ $\;$ Allow players to wear jersey tops on game days, except to church

Dress Code Guidelines for Transition Year

(2016-17)

- Bottoms: same 4 colors as goal year (black, khaki, gray and navy)
- <u>Tops</u>: any solid color
- All clothing should still fall within the goal year parameters (styles, length, etc.)
- ***Changes/modifications may be made in the future by the Headmaster and/or school board, as situations arise that warrant change.
