Hello KCSS Families,

I'm excited to share that KCSS students have completed learning about our first Character Trait: Responsibility. The 3rd Grade wrote and illustrated ways they show responsibility for the Guidance Bulletin Board at Holy Cross. The 8th Grade Leader of the Week students were asked to share how they are responsible, and their answers were displayed on their poster in the hallway. At St. Al's, Kindergarten learned about responsibility through a story about being dependable and did a wonderful job coloring the characters.

In addition to these displays and projects, other grades participated in many other fun activities such as responsibility court, responsibility critical thinking activities, and writing stories about responsibility. Students also learned about study skills and organization to encourage the development of good study habits.

Next week the students will start learning about the second Character Trait: Respect. This unit will also include Red Ribbon Week, which will be celebrated during the last week of October (see Red Ribbon Week Article for more information). During Red Ribbon Week and throughout this character trait unit, Guidance Classes will help students learn about how to respect their bodies by being drug and alcohol free, making safe decisions, and internet safety. Students will also learn more about bullying and respecting others throughout this unit and the next. To continue to help students learn about responsibility and respect, please watch for an article in next week's newsletter. This article will focus on ways to further help your child(ren) enhance their study skills, demonstrate respect, and learn what bullying means.

Please help teach your children what it means to be respectful and ask them to share what they have learned in Guidance Class. Red Ribbon Week October 28 - November 1, 2013

This year KCSS will be celebrating Red Ribbon Week in order to focus on Drug and Alcohol Awareness. During Guidance Class, students will be pledging to be drug free and live healthy lifestyles. Students at Holy Cross will be learning about the harmful effects of drugs and alcohol. St. Al's students will be introduced to medicine and how it can have benefits, but also be harmful to children when taken without adult supervision. Students will also learn about stranger safety and the importance of a healthy lifestyle.

In addition to Guidance Classes, there will be special days for students to show their support for a drug free life. On **Monday, October 28**, students can celebrate the theme "I'm Too Bright for Drugs!" by wearing bright or neon colored shirts. On **Tuesday, October 29**, students can celebrate the theme "Follow Your Dreams, Don't Do Drugs" by wearing pajamas. **Wednesday, October 30**, will have the theme "One School, One Goal, Bully and Drug Free" and students are encouraged to wear school colors. **On Thursday, October 31**, students can show why they are against drugs by "Teaming Up Against Drugs" and wear their favorite sports team attire. We will finish off the week on **Friday, November 1**, by having students wear dress code appropriate red shirts to promote Red Ribbon Week. Remember, Friday is a mass day (All Saints Day) at both campuses this week so **no tee shirts** allowed.
