

Opus 34 Taylo<mark>r</mark> & Boody Organbuilders Staunton, Virginia

The mechanical action organ, originally built in 2000 utilizing traditional principles, is comprised of three manuals. Of the 37 stops, five were added in 2014, thanks to a generous bequest by parishioner Dennis Case, marking the completion of Opus 34.

Much of the walnut and burled walnut case was locally cut and sawn. Of particular interest are the carvings on the organ that include Carolina Wrens, sparrows, an owl, several mockingbirds, and a cardinal. Trinity is grateful to have such a fine instrument to lead in song and liturgy.
