Speaking Pastorally

Dear Friends,

Out in the hallways, at the office, in the Meetinghouse and at the beach, people are talking about vacation plans. Summer is upon us. The promise of lazy, heat soaked days ahead is in the air and with it, the opportunity to slow down in this maddeningly busy culture. Everyone complained about winter for so long and now, presto! We live in summer days.

In these refulgent days, I will be joining all of you in the exciting task of welcoming Rev. Richard DenUyl as he and his family begin their move to Greenwich and Richard begins his ministry to First Church. I share the excitement all of you feel as a new era of faith and service begins for this congregation. And I feel the bittersweet sadness of Dan England's departure as he embraces a new life chapter of interim ministry in Litchfield. I will dearly miss Dan and Mark and Avery and all of you! I will miss this wonderful church and will always feel privileged to have served here. For I am getting ready to pack and move too.

"All change is a miracle to contemplate, yet it is a miracle that is happening all the time," said Thoreau. So I must tell you that I am watching and participating in all this change with a sense of wonder. If I watch carefully, I can see the spark of God's grace shining in these moments. And as my days for writing to you and preaching to you dwindle this July and August, I want to, again, express a foundational tenet of my faith. So a poem:

Now it looks like a plate of rice and fish, now a cliff covered with vines, now a horse being saddled. It hides within these, till one day it cracks them open. ~ Persian mystic poet, Rumi

I am convinced that everything, finally, is sacred. God's joy often hides in the unmarked boxes of our lives. But it is there always, waiting for us to pay attention closely enough to crack open. And when it cracks open, it reveals wonder and joy even in the things we fear, like change.

So I implore you to take the time to look closely at this beautiful old world in these lazy summer days. Look at anything, anyone, any situation long and hard enough to see God's joy appear. Fear and stress and a thousand distractions constantly pull our attention away from this promise. But when you remember that it is there and really, really look, God's joy will shine out to heal your wounds and inspire you to a life made new.

From the Parish ... Have a Safe Summer

Some folks choose to take a break from the usual routine to take up physical activities they might not have had time for over the cooler months. A recent interview with the medical director of Greenwich Hospital's Emergency Department, Christopher Davison, MD, revealed a trend. "Every summer we see an increase in the same types of accidents," he noted, explaining that the summer brings a rise in ER visits for head injuries, broken bones, burns, sprains, and even poisoning from food and sun. "A little precaution goes a long way when it comes to summer safety," said Dr. Davison. Here are some common-sense reminders to help your family stay out of the ER and out having fun:

- Warm Up and Stretch Out: Good advice before any physical activity such as a run, hike, skate or swim.
- **Proper Footwear:** Will reduce the risk of injuries like twisted ankles, cuts, and broken toes.
- **Bicycles:** Wear a helmet, no matter how old you are. If you have an accident, wearing a helmet reduces your risk of injury by 85 percent.
- Skateboards and In-line Skates: Helmet rule applies, and wrist guards for in-line skates. Consider taking a lesson. Our town has great "ramp camps" and clinics offered at the Greenwich Skate Park on Arch Street.
- Water Skiing and Wake Boarding: Keep your body away from the boat propeller. Wear a life jacket, regardless of how strong a swimmer you are.
- Swimming: Never swim alone; use the buddy system. Keep pools locked if a grown-up is not on-site.
- **Trampolines:** Make sure springs are fully covered, netting is intact and only one person jumps at a time.
- Sunburn: Use sunscreen and reapply often. It takes a while for the skin to absorb the active ingredient, so apply sunscreen before you go out, taking special care with small children.
- Lawn Mowers: Keep your hands away from the blades. Always turn the mower off before clearing obstructions or debris. And remember that rocks you run over can shoot out of the side at nearly 200 mph! Safety goggles are a good precaution.
- Hydration: Drink water, especially when playing sports or staying in the hot sun. Alcohol causes dehydration.
- **Picnics:** Keep cold foods cold, hot foods hot, and when in doubt, throw it out to avoid food poisoning.
- **BBQ Grills:** Use long-handled utensils. Check gas grill hoses for cracks or leaks. Never use gasoline to start a fire.

Armed with the above precautions, it wouldn't hurt to ask God for a little protection as well. I pray that you and your family have a safe and blessed summer.

Summer Church School







The Rummage Room Questionnaire: Where does the money go?

This question is often asked while customers are paying for their purchases. A current list of the charities financially supported by funds from The Rummage Room is kept in the shop for just such questions. The Rummage Room treasurers are Erna Olson and Susan Tedford. Several times a year, after all expenses of running the shop have been paid (rent, utilities, salaries, etc.), they turn over to the treasurer of the Women's Fellowship, Kathy Riley, proceeds of The Rummage Room. This money is kept in a separate fund to be disbursed in the spring of each year. In January the Allocations Committee of the Women's Fellowship gets to work deciding which charities to fund. They base their selections on three criteria: 1) organizations that support women's and children's welfare, 2) a mixture of local, national and international appeals, 3) "start-up" or underfunded groups that apply for financial assistance.

In May, at the Annual Meeting of the Women's Fellowship, a vote of all members authorizes that the funds be disbursed. In recent years, the average annual disbursement has been \$150,000. The Fellowship estimates that over \$4,000,000 has been donated since 1964! Of course, this success would not be possible without the volunteers who work in the shop or participate in the committees that oversee it. Also, The Rummage Room depends on generous donations from the community to keep its shelves stocked with great merchandise. Donating and shopping are ways the congregation can participate in this mission.

Stephen Ministry - Next Training Class Begins in October
