MINUTES OF A MEETING OF THE CONSTITUTION SUB-COMMITTEE OF USSA AND THE CONSTITUTION TASK TEAM HELD AT THE MANNAH GUEST HOUSE, KEMPTON PARK ON TUESDAY, 18 SEPTEMBER 2012 AT 10:00

1. Confirming the Chair and Secretary of the meeting

Chaka Croukamp requested that a Chair be appointed. It was agreed that Jerry Laka would act as Chairperson and Anton Louw as Secretary.

2. Confirming the agenda

The agenda was approved as presented.

3. Welcome

Jerry Laka welcomed all those present to the meeting and confirmed that the purpose of the meeting was to try and reach common ground on the proposed amendments to the USSA Constitution.

4. Attendance Register and Apologies

5. Background information

The Chair of the task team provided background information confirming the processes that resulted in the formation of the Task Team. The process started with the initial proposal to change the USSA Constitution at the General Council Meeting in February leading to a Special General Meeting in June. A Task Team was appointed who further reviewed the proposed amendments and compiled a new document that was then circulated to all USSA Members for comments.

Comments were received from various members where after a final document was drafted and submitted to the USSA Office for circulation. The President mentioned that he had not seen the final draft and enquired why no further input was requested. Mr Croukamp replied that the task team had considered all input and made some changes after which they decided to conclude with the draft. The document was sent to the USSA Secretary General who then as agreed called for a combined meeting of the USSA Constitutional Sub Committee and the Task Team to try and reach consensus on the proposals before final submission at a Special General Meeting scheduled for 12 October 2012.

The meeting agreed that only substantial matters would be discussed and that other smaller issues such as terminological changes, sentence construction, etc. should be left as is for consideration at the SGM.

6. Discussions on substantive issues

6.1 Definition bona fide students (Article 3.4.1)

Ms Coetzee circulated a document that she had compiled of different definitions of Bona Fide students as implemented by FISU, USSA (current), Academic Registrars (suggested) and the Varsity Cup Executive Committee. Explanations were given of bridging and extended courses.

After consideration the meeting recommended the following as definition

A bona fide student is defined as a person who:

- (a) Is officially registered at an Institution of Higher Education recognised by the appropriate National Education Authority in the country (i.e. Department of Higher Education and Training) for a course on at least NQF Level 5, consisting of a minimum of 120 SAQA credits and is approved by that institution's senate. This includes bridging courses although only one (1) attempt at completing any bridging course will be allowed at any institution. It also includes extended courses which offer the required 120 SAQA credit;
- (b) It excludes students enrolled for short courses or registered for courses or modules or units of study;
- (c) Actively involved in pursuing his/her academic career, i.e. attending lectures, submitting assignments, writing tests and examinations in order to be promoted to the next level of study.

The meeting encouraged the creation of a whistle blowing mechanism in this regard – especially to assist the NUSAs. The meeting further confirmed that the definitions should be captured under Terms and Abbreviations of the Constitution as well as **Article 3.4.1** of the USSA Regulations.

6.2 USSA Membership (Article 7)

The committee deliberated on membership issues and whether FET Colleges should be accepted as member. The President commented that it is a highly politicised issue and that USSA should concur with the policy of the Department of Higher education.

Mr Croukamp commented that the FET Colleges were in the process of forming their own structure and that it wouldn't make sense for them to then also be allowed membership of USSA. They should however be allowed a grace period of one year as member of USSA. Ms Coetzee confirmed that the USSA Secretary General had attended a meeting of the FET Colleges where the process was confirmed and a date for the launch of the structure was announced. Mr Croukamp further commented that the FET Colleges would receive their own funding and that they could apply for LOTTO funding independently from USSA.

The meeting acknowledged that a link should be established between the FET Colleges and USSA which may allow students of FET colleges, who meet the FISU requirements, to compete at FISU events.

6.3 Structure (Article 8)

The President proposed a different structure to the one that was originally proposed. The meeting considered the suggestion favourably apart from not agreeing on the position of a Financial Officer. The President felt that the NEC after taking office could designate one of their members to fulfil this role. The rest of the meeting disagreed and concluded that the position should be identified as a Financial Officer/manager and elected as such.

After further discussions and input the meeting decided to submit two alternative structures for consideration at the SGM which would address different options for the position of the Finance Officer.

Note: a minimum of 2 students should serve as additional members and at least three (3) shall be staff members.

- 6.3.1 The president shall be a Vice-Chancellor and Principal, Deputy Vice-Chancellor, Vice-Principal of a member institution of Higher Education or a Council Chairperson and shall serve in an honorary capacity on the recommendation of the NEC. The President will chair all relevant USSA meetings.
- 6.3.2 The 1st Vice-President will chair USSA meetings in the absence of the President.
- 6.3.3 The 2nd Vice-President will be the Chairperson of the Student Forum. In the absence of the President and 1st Vice-President, he/she will chair all USSA meetings. This position will be occupied by a student who is at least in his second year of study.
- 6.3.4 Five (5) x Additional members of which at least two (2) shall be students and at least three (3) shall be staff members.
- 6.3.5 At least one staff member and one student shall be female.

6.4 Voting

6.4.1 Voting of constituent members (Article 12.2)

The meeting discussed at length the proposal of a weighted voting system of institutions. Factors that were considered to be taken into account were:

- The number of students per institution;
- A spread of different philosophies / focus areas of universities;
- Contribution towards membership and fees paid annually;
- Number of codes affiliated to USSA.

Possible scenarios that were discussed:

Scenario One

A 3-tier system based on number of students with:

- the top tier allowing 8 universities with 3 votes - Tota

- Total 24 votes

- 2nd block of 12 universities with 2 votes each

- Total 24 votes

- 3rd block with 15+ universities

- Total 15+ votes

Scenario Two

- 25000 students or more and affiliated to 12 codes or less 2 votes
- Less than 25000 students and affiliated to 12 codes or less 1 vote

One (1) additional vote for affiliating to more than 12 codes.

The meeting could not reach consensus and decided to submit the original proposal to change the constitution to the General Council to decide, or possibly refer back for further investigation.

6.4.2 Voting by NEC (Article 12.3)

The original proposal with regard to voting powers of member institutions and the NEC will be submitted to the SGM for consideration.

7. Other Constitutional amendments

- 7.1 Term of Office
- 7.1.1 The meeting decided that USSA should follow the SASCOC policy of serving a 4 year term that would coincide with the Olympic cycle. It was agreed that members should be elected in a staggered manner but that the matter would be referred to the new NEC for further investigation.
- 7.1.2 Staff members who leave the university will vacate his/her position with immediate effect.
- 7.1.3 Students who complete their studies will be allowed to retain the position until the end of the year of his/her graduation or a new election whatever comes first.
- 7.1.4 Students who are no longer registered will vacate their positions with immediate effect.
- 7.2 Casting vote The meeting agreed that Article 12.5 should be submitted as is with a possible amendment depending on the new structure to be decided on (President/Chairperson).
- 7.3 Article 19 The meeting noted that the proposed amendments to Article 19 would clarify the conditions under which amendments to the constitution could be done to prevent disagreement or differences in interpretations.

The way forward

It was agreed that the minutes of the meeting as well as a new draft document with all the decisions taken at the meeting would be circulated to members of the USSA Constitutional Sub—Committee as well as the Constitutional Review Task Team for ratification and then to the USSA Secretary General by **1 October 2012**.

12. Closure

There being no further matters to discuss, the Chair thanked everybody for their contributions and closed the meeting at 15h45.

THE CONSTITUTION OF UNIVERSITY SPORT SOUTH AFRICA

(Amended: <u>1 OCTOBER 2012</u>9 APRIL 2011)

PREAMBLE AND FOUNDING PRINCIPLES

WHEREAS the sport <u>fraternity spersons</u> of South African <u>iInstitutions</u> of <u>Higher tertiary</u> e<u>E</u>ducation note that the <u>disparities emanating from state of fragmentation of student sport in</u> South Africa's <u>historical past was caused by policies</u> of intentional racial division and discrimination; and <u>the lack of access to sporting that these policies removed from the majority of South African students the opportunitiesy and the inequitable distribution of resources among Institutions of Higher Education to acquire and enhance their sporting skills and to participate freely and normally; and recognisinge the need to <u>promote unity</u> access and equity in sport <u>spersons participation</u> at all South African tertiary <u>iInstitutions of Higher Education</u>; and <u>to for the improvement of opportunities for the development and enhancement acquisition</u> of sporting skills by all South African students.</u>

And WHEREAS the founder member of Institutions of Higher Education and their representative organisations herein mentioned haveing agreed to establish one united national body representing the interests of all bona fide students-athletes at tertiary educational institutions of Higher Education who are registered participants in sports which are recognised by the appropriate national and international sports structures; WHILST also noting the fact of system differentiation in South African tertiary institutions of Higher Education of higher education that has lead reflected in the existence of distinct university and college sectors; to the possibility of different developmental needs, focus, the differences in the logical-organisation, management and resourcing of sport programmes; and recognising that all of the above may have an effect and bearing on the sporting and aspirations needs—of participants particular sectors.

THEREFORE the sport fraternity spersons of South African institutions of Higher tertiary enducation commit themselves through the medium of sport and sporting contact to the establishment, development and promotion of a sport programmespeaceful, united, non racial, non sexist and democratic society where all people are equal before the law; that programmes that embody the values and tenets implied in the Constitution of the Republic of South Africa and its Bill of Rights through organisational structures and continuing interaction among members, thereby where they may compete equally in sporting competitions; where the tenets

The name of the organisation shall be the UNIVERSITY SPORT SOUTH AFRICA 2.1 (Hereinafter referred to as USSA), whose powers, duties and obligations are set forth

- 4.2 The colours of the USSA emblem shall be green and gold.
- 4.3 The headquarters of USSA shall be situated in the city of Tshwane or any other city determined by Council from time to time.

ARTICLE 5: AREA OF JURISDICTION

This Constitution shall be governed by, interpreted and applied in all respects in accordance with South African law. The area of jurisdiction of USSA shall be the Republic of South Africa in all matters relating to this Constitution.

ARTICLE 6: <u>LEGAL STATUS AND INDEMNITY</u>

- 6.1 USSA shall have a legal personality and independent existence and have the capacity to sue or be sued in its own name. Every office bearer, official or employee of USSA shall not be liable for any of the obligations and liabilities of USSA solely by virtue of their status members or as office bearers, officials or employees of USSA.
- 6.2 Every office bearer, official or employee of USSA shall be indemnified by USSA against all costs, losses and expenses which he/she may incur or become liable for by reason of any act or omission in discharge of his duties, unless the loss in question is

caused by his/her own gross negligence, dishonesty or intentional actions which may bring the organisation <u>USSA</u> into disrepute.

- No <u>person-Individual</u> or <u>mM</u>ember shall have any right to claim assets belonging to USSA, nor incur any liabilities for its obligation.
 - 6.4 Except for reasonable compensation for services rendered to the organisation, USSA may not allot any of its money or property, whether movable or immovable, to its mMembers or office bearers.
 - All legal proceedings shall be brought by or against USSA, and USSA may authorise any member of its National Executive Committee to act on its behalf and to sign all such documents and to take all such steps as may be necessary in connection with any such proceedings.

- 6.7 USSA shall not be responsible for liabilities incurred by founder Mmembers or Individuals prior to its formal and legal establishment. [Must be discussed.]

ARTICLE 7: COMPOSITION AND MEMBERSHIP

- 7.1 USSA shall be composed of tertiary iInstitutions of Higher Education in the Republic of South Africa that have applied and have been admitted to membership within the boundaries as defined in Article 5 of this Constitution, who are admitted to membership.
- 7.2 Membership may be granted to <u>public and private tertiary institutions Institutions of Higher Education that offer academic qualifications at the NQF Level 5 and above and are registered with the Department of Higher Eudcation. higher education programmes.</u>
- 7.3 Only registered bona fide students of a <u>member_Member_of USSA</u> shall be entitled to participate in events or in teams to <u>participate_under</u> the jurisdiction of <u>USSA</u>, <u>CUCSA, FASU and FISU or USSA</u>.

The composition of the NEC shall be made up of a minimum of three (3) bona fide students and a minimum of three (3) administrators/officials in the employ of a member. The President shall be a bona fide student and the Chairperson shall be an official.

The president shall be a Vice-Chancellor and Principal, Deputy Vice-Chancellor or Vice Principal or chairperson of Council of a member institution of Higher Education elected for a two or four year term and shall serve in an honorary capacity on the recommendation of the NEC.

The 1st Vice President shall be a staff member at the level of Director, Deputy

Director, or Head of Sport or Deputy Head of Sport at a member institution of Higher

Education.

<u>The 2nd Vice President shall be a senior student in at least his/her 2nd academic year of study.</u>

The Treasurer (or 3rd Vice President Finance and Marking) shall be a senior permanent sport staff member at a member institution of Higher Education. (See proposed structures addendums A and B).

Five additional members who shall be either staff or students and of which at least two shall be students.

At least one staff member and one student shall be female.

- 10.1 A Special General Meeting (SGM) of USSA shall be called for a specific purpose:
- _______upon written request of at least forty percent (40%) of the mMembers of USSA;
 - 10.1.2 by the . The NEC, AGM or Council may also call an SGM.
- 10.2 The Chairperson shall convene an SGM within forty (40) days of receipt of such request.
- 10.3 The notice of an SGM shall contain the nature and grounds of the reason for the meeting.

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ARTICLE 11: QUORUMS

For all meetings the quorum shall be fifty percent plus one (50% + 1) of all possible votes.

ARTICLE 12: VOTING

Only mMembers in good standing with USSA, including paid up affiliation and staff fees may participate in the voting process. The staff or student member attending the meeting may submit a written proxy on behalf of the person not attending. Such written proxy must be submitted with the letters of credence or prior to commencement of the meeting (as per clause 8.5.4), At least one delegate must attend the meeting in person.

12.2 Constituent members shall be accorded votes according to their enrolement numbers amount of membership and fees paid each year. Constituent members shall be accordinged votes in the following manner:

12.2.1 —Universities with more that 25 000 students: 3 votes. Members paying membership and fees over R100, 000,00 per year: 3 votes

—Universities with more than 10 000 students: 2 votes. Members paying membership and fees between R50, 000.00 and R99, 000.00 per year: 2 votes

—Universities with less than 10 000 students: 1 vote Members paying membership and fees of R49, 000.00 or less: 1 vote

<u>Each member of the NEC, each fully represented mMember (institution) and each National University Sport Association to the Council AGM or SGM shall have one (1) vote. However, only members of the NEC and each fully represented Member Institutions of Higher Education may participate and vote in the election process for the NEC.</u>

12.3 Each member of the NEC and each delegate to the Council shall have one (1) vote.

12.4 Each member of the NEC shall have one (1) vote at all meetings of the Executive Committee.

12.5 At all meetings, the Chairperson of the meeting shall have a casting vote, except during elections of the NEC and constitutional amendments. However, the Chairperson shall have a casting vote in Council, such a vote representing the decision of the NEC on the specific matter under discussion.

- 12.6 The Chairperson shall propose, for the approval of the meeting, an electoral officer and at least three (3) scrutineers for all voting.
- 12.7 Voting at all USSA meetings may employ one of the following methods as approved by the meeting by:

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12.7.1 Aby a show of hands; or

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ARTICLE 13: RULES AND REGULATIONS

- 13.1 In addition to the provisions of this Constitution, the NEC shall issue such rules and regulations as may be approved by the Council and/or AGM for the smooth running of the affairs of USSA.
- 13.2 Such rules and regulations shall be amended by the Council for ratification by the AGM.
- 13.3 Any amendment of the rules and regulations shall be entered in the minutes of the particular Council meeting at which such amendments have been passed. If the minutes have been duly circulated, as provided for in the Constitution, this shall be deemed sufficient notice of such amendments.

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ARTICLE 14: SUBSCRIPTIONS

The Council shall before the end of October June of each year, determine subscriptions payable by Mmembers and such other fees and levies as deemed necessary.

ARTICLE 15: FINANCE

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- 15.1 The NEC, as authorised by the Council, shall open and operate a banking account with a registered banking institution in South Africa in accordance with the financial regulations approved by Council.
- There shall be two (2) signatories to every cheque or instrument drawn on the banking account, one of whom shall be the <u>Treasurer Finance and Marketing Officer and/or</u> the Secretary General and any other official delegated by the NEC.
- 15.3 The <u>Treasurer</u>, with the help of the <u>Secretary General</u>/Chief Executive Officer shall submit an annual auditor's report as well as an audited financial statement to the AGM.
 - 15.4 The financial year of USSA shall commence on the first day of January and end on the last day of December of each calendar year.
 - 15.5 Affiliation fees shall be payable by the thirty-first day of March of each year.
- The <u>Secretary General/Chief Executive Officer shall keep proper books of account,</u> which books shall record all financial transactions by USSA, and such books of account shall be reconciled regularly with the banking account of USSA.
- 15.7 The auditors shall be appointed by the NEC for ratification by the AGM.

ARTICLE 16: DISCIPLINE

Any <u>mMember or iIndividual who</u>, contravenes any of the terms or provisions of this Constitution, or fails or refuses to implement any lawful decision of the Council, the NEC, or any standing committee of USSA, shall be charged with misconduct as provided for in the rules and regulations of the Council.

ARTICLE 17: ANTI DOPING

<u>USSA shall recognise Doping is strictly forbidden and constitutes a doping offence under the</u> Regulations of <u>Drug-Free Sport South Africa</u>, FISU and in terms of the World Anti Doping Code. USSA shall make appropriate Anti-Doping Regulations, governing the use of drugs and imposing prescribed sanctions where a doping offence <u>shall haves been</u> found to have been committed. In terms of the said Regulations of FISU and the World Anti Doping Agency, USSA shall implement and apply the said Regulations save to the extent that the said Regulations need to be varied to take into account the requirements of governmental legislation and the national drug testing authorities and/or as otherwise provided for in the said Regulations of FISU.

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ARTICLE 18: DISPUTE RESOLUTION

- Any dispute arising carried forward from the above, or any dispute between any 18.2 Mmember of the NEC and USSA itself, shall be referred to the Arbitration Federation of Southern Africa (AFSA) for resolution through mediation or expedited arbitration in terms of the Rules and Procedures for the Resolution of Disputes in Sport, prevailing at the time such dispute is so referred. In the event of arbitration in terms of the afore-going, such resolution shall be final and binding on the parties in the dispute.

ARTICLE 19: AMENDMENT OF THE CONSTITUTION

19.1 This constitution may be amended at the AGM. Recommendations for amendments may be submitted by any member or the NEC and does not require a seconder on submission. Recommendations for amendments must be forwarded to the secretary 20 days prior to the AGM (refer article 9).

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- This constitution may also be amended at an SGM of USSA called specifically for that purpose upon written request of at least 40% of the members of USSA.
- The said amendments shall be passed by a majority of two thirds (²/₃) of those present 19.3 and entitled to vote at such meeting.
- 19.4 The Rules and Regulations will be updated to include all consequential changes brought about by amendments to the constitution,
- This Constitution may be amended at the AGM or at an SGM of USSA called specifically for that purpose upon written request of at least forty percent (40%) of the Mmembers of USSA.
- The said amendment shall be passed by a majority of two thirds (%) of those present and entitled to vote at such meeting.
- 19.5 Any constitutional changes are immediately applicable upon adoption by the AGM, SGM or Council.

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ARTICLE 20: DISSOLUTION

- 20.1 USSA shall be dissolved upon a resolution passed by a majority of two thirds of the Mmembers at an SGM called specifically for that purpose.
- 20.2 Upon dissolution and after the satisfaction of all its debts and liabilities, any property whatsoever in the possession of USSA shall by a resolution of the General Meeting of members, be given or transferred to another non-profit organisation that has similar objectives.

THE CONSTITUTION OF UNIVERSITY SPORT SOUTH AFRICA

(Amended: 1 OCTOBER 2012)

PREAMBLE AND FOUNDING PRINCIPLES

WHEREAS the sport fraternity of South African Institutions of Higher Education note that the disparities emanating from South Africa's historical past of intentional racial division and discrimination; and the lack of access to sporting opportunities and the inequitable distribution of resources among Institutions of Higher Education; and recognising the need to promote unity, access and equity in sport participation at all South African Institutions of Higher Education; and to improve opportunities for the development and enhancement of sporting skills by all South African students.

And WHEREAS the founder member of Institutions of Higher Education and their representative organisations herein mentioned having agreed to establish one united national body representing the interests of all bona fide student-athletes at Institutions of Higher Education which are recognised by the appropriate national and international sports structures; WHILST also noting the system differentiation in South African Institutions of Higher Education that has lead to different developmental needs, focus, differences in the organisation, management and resourcing of sport programmes; and that all of the above may have an effect and bearing on the sporting and aspirations of participants.

THEREFORE the sport fraternity of South African Institutions of Higher Education commit themselves to the establishment, development and promotion of a sport programmes that embody the values and tenets implied in the Constitution of the Republic of South Africa and its Bill of Rights through organisational structures and continuing interaction among members, thereby where they may compete equally in sport competitions; and where the principles of accountability are upheld; thereby agreeing to pursue and promote equal access and opportunities to all who desire and aspire to participate in sport at Higher Education Institutions.

This Constitution as amended, was approved by the Annual General Meeting of University Sport South Africa (USSA) held at the CSIR ICC, City of Tshwane, on 9 April 2011. [To be decided]

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ARTICLE 1: FOUNDER ORGANISATIONS

The founder organisations of University Sport South Africa (USSA) are the institutions formerly represented by the South African Student Sports Union (SASSU), i.e. South African Universities Sports Council, the South African Colleges Sports Association, the South African Technikons Sports Council and the South African Tertiary Institutions Sports Union.

ARTICLE 2: NAME AND STRUCTURE

- 2.1 The name of the organisation shall be **UNIVERSITY SPORT SOUTH AFRICA** (Hereinafter referred to as USSA), whose powers, duties and obligations are set forth herein.
- USSA is a registered Non-Profit Organisation (NPO) established and incorporated under the Non-Profit Organisations Act 71 of 1997.
- 2.3 These Articles of the Constitution of "USSA", as set out herein, shall cancel and replace any previous articles of the Constitution of the association, not withstanding anything to the contrary included in such previous articles of the Constitution, where applicable, and shall become full force as effect from the ______ 2012.

ARTICLE 3: AIMS AND OBJECTIVES

The aims of USSA shall be to develop and enhance the environment in which Member Institutions of Higher Education and their bona fide students shall participate in Sport.

The objectives of USSA shall therefore be:

- 3.1 To facilitate and influence the development of sport by promoting mass bona fide student participation through intramural, inter-campus and other forms and to promote high performance from elite performers;
- 3.2 To safeguard and ensure the proper implementation and adherence to the Republic of South Africa's sport policies and regulations with respect to USSA games, tournaments and championships;
- To liaise and advocate matters of interest to macro sports bodies, relevant government departments and various stakeholders with respect to USSA's aims and objectives;
- 3.4 To identify and facilitate the affiliation of USSA to FISU, FASU and CUCSA to allow South African Institutions of Higher Education to participate in various international competitions, and influence decision making processes of these structures;
- 3.5 To ensure that all student sport associations share the same vision and aspirations as USSA, and facilitate and promote the formation of sport associations when a need arises;

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- To raise and administer funds of USSA in accordance with the Non Profit Organisation Act 71 of 1997 by means of subscription, donations and sponsorships;
- 3.7 To facilitate the selection, preparation and delivery of national student teams and/or athletes to international tournaments in consultation with SASCOC and other applicable national federations;
- 3.8 To establish and develop rules and regulations to ensure that USSA programmes are carried out in a sustainable and consistent manner, and in accordance with the Constitution of USSA and any applicable legislation;
- 3.9. To facilitate the organisation, management, monitoring and evaluation of national games and championships in the Republic of South Africa for Member Institutions of Higher Education;
- 3.10 To take such steps as may be necessary to incorporate and promote the objects, intents and purpose of USSA if deemed advisable.

ARTICLE 4: EMBLEM, COLOURS AND HEADQUARTERS

- 4.1 The emblem of USSA shall be the Protea (Cynaroides) flower with stem and two leaves, one on either side, with the five (5) stars of FISU underneath.
- 4.2 The colours of the USSA emblem shall be green and gold.
- 4.3 The headquarters of USSA shall be situated in the city of Tshwane or any other city determined by Council from time to time.

ARTICLE 5: AREA OF JURISDICTION

This Constitution shall be governed by, interpreted and applied in all respects in accordance with South African law. The area of jurisdiction of USSA shall be the Republic of South Africa in all matters relating to this Constitution.

ARTICLE 6: <u>LEGAL STATUS AND INDEMNITY</u>

- USSA shall have a legal personality and independent existence and have the capacity to sue or be sued in its own name. Every office bearer, Official or employee of USSA shall not be liable for any of the obligations and liabilities of USSA solely by virtue of their status as office bearers, officials or employees of USSA.
- 6.2 Every office bearer, official or employee of USSA shall be indemnified by USSA against all costs, losses and expenses which he/she may incur or become liable for by reason of any act or omission in discharge of his duties, unless the loss in question is caused by his/her own gross negligence, dishonesty or intentional actions which may bring USSA into disrepute.

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- No Individual or Member shall have any right to claim assets belonging to USSA, nor incur any liabilities for its obligation.
- 6.4 Except for reasonable compensation for services rendered to the organisation, USSA may not allot any of its money or property, whether movable or immovable, to its Members or office bearers.
- All legal proceedings shall be brought by or against USSA, and USSA may authorise any member of its National Executive Committee to act on its behalf and to sign all such documents and to take all such steps as may be necessary in connection with any such proceedings.
- 6.6 Office bearers, Officials and employees of USSA shall be indemnified by USSA against pecuniary loss sustained by reason of legal proceedings, arising out of whatsoever cause, instituted against USSA or against such office bearer, official or employee in his/her representative capacity, provided that the indemnity conveyed herein shall not extend to private, personal acts of such office bearers, officials or employees, acts outside the course and scope of their employment (in the case of employees), and/or acts outside the official appointment and tenure of office in USSA (in the case of office bearers and officials).
- 6.7 USSA shall not be responsible for liabilities incurred by founder Members or Individuals prior to its formal and legal establishment. [Must be discussed]

ARTICLE 7: COMPOSITION AND MEMBERSHIP

- 7.1 USSA shall be composed of Institutions of Higher Education in the Republic of South Africa that have applied and have been admitted to membership within the boundaries as defined in Article 5 of this Constitution, who are admitted to membership.
- 7.2 Membership may be granted to public and private Institutions of Higher Education that offer academic qualifications at the NQF Level 5 and above and are registered with the Department of Higher Education.
- 7.3 Only registered bona fide students of a Member of USSA shall be entitled to participate in events or in teams to participate under the jurisdiction of USSA, CUCSA, FASU and FISU.
- Honorary membership shall be granted by the Annual General Meeting (AGM) of USSA to such persons as shall have made exceptional contributions to student sport in South Africa. Such honorary members may attend all Council and General Meetings of USSA and may speak, but shall not have the vote.
- 7.5 Only Managers and/or Officials and bona fide students of Member institutions nominated by Members are eligible to stand for and be elected to portfolios of USSA.
- 7.6 Affiliation fees shall be proposed by the Council and agreed to (by majority vote) by those present at USSA's Annual General Meeting.

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ARTICLE 8: STRUCTURES

8.5 MEMBERS

- 8.5.1 The constituent membership shall comprise of Institutions of Higher Education admitted as Members of USSA and who have paid the applicable membership fees for the year.
- 8.5.2 The Institution of Higher Education shall be admitted to USSA on submitting a written application and payment of the annual subscription and salary contribution.
- 8.5.3 The Institutions so admitted, shall exclude individual campuses of an Institution of Higher Education, though such campuses shall register as clubs in USSA. (NUSAs)
- 8.5.4 The Institutions of Higher Education shall be represented at all official meetings of USSA by not more than two (2) delegates, one of whom shall be a full or part time sports manager, administrator or official in the employ of the Member, and one a bona fide student who qualifies in terms of Article 7.2.

 The staff or student member attending the meeting may submit a written proxy on behalf of the person not attending. Such written proxy must be submitted with the
 - behalf of the person not attending. Such written proxy must be submitted with the letters of credence or prior to commencement of the meeting. At least one delegate must attend the meeting in person.
- 8.5.5 Institutions shall have the obligation to pay subscriptions to the various national sport associations as well as to USSA.

8.1 <u>NATIONAL EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE (NEC)</u>

- 8.1.1 The NEC shall comprise of the following:
 - President
 - 1st Vice President
 - 2nd Vice President
 - Secretary General (ex-officio)
 - Treasurer / 3rd Vice President Finance and Marketing
 - Five (5) Members

The president shall be a Vice-Chancellor and Principal, Deputy Vice-Chancellor or Vice Principal or chairperson of Council of a member institution of Higher Education elected for a two or four year term and shall serve in an honorary capacity on the recommendation of the NEC.

The 1st Vice President shall be a staff member at the level of Director, Deputy Director, Head of Sport or Deputy Head of Sport at a member institution of Higher Education.

The 2nd Vice President shall be a senior student in at least his/her 2nd academic year of study.

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The Treasurer (or 3rd Vice President Finance and Marking) shall be a senior permanent sport staff member at a member institution of Higher Education. [See proposed structures in minutes of Constitutional Meeting, addendums A and B]

Five additional members who shall be either staff or students and of which at least two shall be students.

At least one staff member and one student shall be female.

"Members elected to the NEC shall immediately relinquish their positions in the NEC when their status, according to which they were elected, change (e.g. student representatives must relinquish their positions if they are no longer students – with exception of sub-clause b) – and staff members must relinquish their positions if they are no longer employed by or are suspended by the member institution).

- Sub-clause a) Members elected to the NEC shall immediately relinquish their positions in the NEC when they are in bad standing with or suspended by any national and/or regional South African sport federation or structure.
- Sub-clause b) Student-members elected to the NEC who obtain their academic qualifications may serve in the NEC for the next calendar year or next election whichever occurs first.
- 8.1.2 The NEC shall be elected triennially or quadriennally at a Special General Meeting to coincide with the October Council meetings of USSA. Student representatives will be elected biennially
- 8.1.3 Not more than two (2) persons representing the same member institution shall be elected to the NEC simultaneously.
- 8.1.4 Members elected to the NEC shall relinquish positions held in any other structures of USSA
- 8.1.5 Elected members of the NEC shall not hold office for more than two (2) consecutive terms.
- 8.1.6 The NEC shall meet at least four (4) times per year with a summary of relevant decisions taken at such a meeting to be circulated to Member institutions, provincial committees and National University Sports Associations within thirty-one (31) days of the meeting.
- 8.1.7 The election of office bearers in the NEC shall be subject to the following terms and conditions:
 - 8.1.7.1 nominations shall be received in writing by the Secretary General at least twenty (20) days prior to the AGM; If constitutional changes regarding structural changes to the NEC are accepted, nominations may be made on a shorter notice period for the first electoral Council meeting following such acceptance of constitutional changes.

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- 8.1.7.2 the aforementioned nominations shall be submitted and signed by those Members nominating them, and each nomination shall be acknowledged by the nominee affixing his/her signature to the nomination form, or confirmation thereof by means of a letter, signifying his/her willingness to accept office in the NEC. In the event of no such acknowledgement being received, such nomination shall be invalid;
- 8.1.7.3 the Secretary General shall, not later than fourteen (14) days before the relevant meeting, notify all institutions, provinces and National University Sports Associations, in writing, of the names of persons nominated along with a brief Curriculum Vitae (CV) of each;
- 8.1.7.4 if no nominations are received for a particular position, nominations may be made from the floor;
- 8.1.7.5 the order of the election shall be that the President shall be elected first and thereafter the AGM shall vote for the persons designated in Article 8.1.1, and in that order.
- Any temporary or part time vacancy amongst the office bearers of the association, except those of Honorary Presidents and/or Honorary office bearers, however caused, shall be filled temporarily by the NEC until the next annual general meeting of the association, provided that, if the circumstances so warrant, the NEC shall be empowered to convene a special general meeting for the purpose of electing a new officer or officers after proper circulation of notice of his intention to all affiliated Members. In the event of the office of Presidents and/or that of the Secretary General becoming vacant for any reason whatsoever, a special general meeting shall be called within thirty (30) days of such vacancy occurring in orders to make a new appointment or appointments.
- 8.1.8 The NEC shall have full and complete control over all activities of USSA subject to:
 - 8.1.8.1 Limits and restrictions imposed by this Constitution;
 - 8.1.8.2 Limits and restrictions imposed by General Meetings and Council.
- 8.1.9 The powers of the NEC shall be as follows:
 - 8.1.9.1 To assume overall responsibility for the management of the affairs of USSA;
 - 8.1.9.2 To appoint, acquire or engage such staff permanently, temporarily or on voluntary basis and to discipline staff as may be determined from time to time:
 - 8.1.9.3 To enter into donor funding arrangements with companies or individuals and to solicit and accept fees, donations, gifts, contributions and subscriptions for the sole use of USSA and its Members;
 - 8.1.9.4 To lease, purchase or otherwise acquire premises, equipment, vehicles, furniture and other property, movable or immovable, which it may deem necessary or convenient, for any purpose of USSA;
 - 8.1.9.5 To facilitate the formation of National University Sports Associations;
 - 8.1.9.6 To delegate the selection of national student teams to represent USSA at international events to the National University Sports Associations;

8.1.9.7 To appoint subcommittees. Recommendations and resolutions of such subcommittees shall be presented to Council for approval or rejection. Council and its appeal board will be final.

8.2 COUNCIL

- 8.2.1 The Council shall comprise of:
 - 8.2.1.1 The NEC:
 - 8.2.1.2 Two (2) delegates from each Member (i.e. affiliated Higher Education Institution in terms of Article 8.5);
 - 8.2.1.3 two (2) delegates from each National University Sport Association in respect of sports recognised by USSA (Article 8.4);
 - 8.2.1.4 two (2) delegates from each province as defined by a resolution of Council (Article 8.3);

Where members, provinces and associations are represented by two (2) delegates, then at least one person must be a bona fide student in terms of Article 7.2 and one a person who is a full or part time sports manager/administrator or official in the employ of a Member.

- 8.2.2 The Council shall meet at least once per year before the end of October or at the request of the NEC.
- 8.2.3 In addition to the powers and duties granted to the Council in terms of any Article of the Constitution, the following further powers shall be vested in the Council:
 - 8.2.3.1 To ratify the decision of the NEC and to fill any vacancies arising in the NEC for the remaining period before the AGM;
 - 8.2.3.2 To adjudicate upon the interpretation of this Constitution or the rules and regulations issued in terms thereof and also to consider matters referred to it by the NEC. The decision of the Council shall be final and binding;
 - 8.2.3.3 To examine and approve reports on all USSA programmes and activities (e.g. tournaments, tours, projects, etc.);
 - 8.2.3.4 To delegate or assign any of its powers or duties to the NEC.
 - 8.2.3.5 To appoint subcommittees.

8.3 **PROVINCIAL COMMITTEES**

- 8.3.1 Member Institutions of Higher Education within the official boundaries of each province shall exercise the right to establish provincial committees where needed.
- 8.3.2 The provincial committee shall be responsible for the following:
 - 8.3.2.1 The responsibility to raise funds by means of sponsorships, donations, or any other means with the approval of the NEC;
 - 8.3.2.2 To run viable programmes for the institutions in their respective regions with the view to selecting provincial or regional representative teams in various codes of sport to participate at various levels of USSA competitions;

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- 8.3.2.3 To submit to the NEC, annual reports relating to their sports programmes;
- 8.3.2.4 To facilitate development programmes in conjunction with provincial federations, where possible.

8.4 <u>NATIONAL UNIVERSITY SPORTS ASSOCIATIONS</u>

- 8.4.1 National University Sports Associations (natural members) shall comply with the following requirements in order to be properly constituted:
 - 8.4.1.1 unity;
 - 8.4.1.2 approved constitution;
 - 8.4.1.3 approved development programme;
 - 8.4.1.4 be represented in at least three (3) provinces.
- 8.4.2 NUSA shall be responsible for the administration of the various codes of sports recognised by the Council.
- 8.4.3 The responsibilities of NUSA shall be the following:
 - 8.4.3.1 The responsibility to organise and co-ordinate their activities and to maximise student participation in Sport under the jurisdiction of USSA;
 - 8.4.3.2 To conduct their own financial affairs with the help of the Secretary General/CEO of USSA; and pursue and acquire sponsorships, subject to the approval of the NEC;
 - 8.4.3.3 To submit to the NEC annual reports of their activities with income and expenditure statements for each project/programme;
 - 8.4.3.4 any other rights or powers which are not incompatible with the provisions of this Constitution, subject to the approval of the Council.
- 8.4.4 The USSA Constitution shall take precedence over that of the National University Sports Associations (NUSA), with the NUSAs' constitution being in alignment with that of National Sports Federations (NSF's).

ARTICLE 9: ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING (AGM)

- 9.1 The AGM shall be held before 30 April of each year for the purpose of transacting such business as required of the general assembly of all institutions, provinces and National University Sports Associations of USSA, and for the purpose of examining financial statements and taking resolutions requiring the approval of the AGM.
- 9.2 Notice, as well as the agenda, of such meeting shall be given at least forty (40) days prior to the meeting.
- 9.3 Motions to an AGM shall be received by the Secretary General of USSA in writing not less than twenty (20) days prior to the date of the AGM. The Secretary General of USSA shall circulate all motions submitted to him/her, and the audited financial statement of USSA to all institutions, provinces and National University Sports Associations, not less than fourteen (14) days prior to the AGM.

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- 9.4 Attendance at the AGM shall be as follows
 - 9.4.1 members of the NEC:
 - 9.4.2 members of the Council; and
 - 9.4.3 not more than two (2) delegates from each Member as defined in Article 8.5.2.
- 9.5 The following matters will be considered at each AGM:
 - 9.5.1 Minutes of previous meeting(s);
 - 9.5.2 Matters arising;
 - 9.5.3 President's address:
 - 9.5.4 NEC Report;
 - 9.5.5 Financial Report;
 - 9.5.6 Motions;
 - 9.5.7 Amendments to the Constitution;
 - 9.5.8 Amendments to the Regulations.

ARTICLE 10: SPECIAL GENERAL MEETING (SGM)

- 10.1 A Special General Meeting (SGM) of USSA shall be called for a specific purpose:
 - 10.1.1 upon written request of at least forty percent (40%) of the Members of USSA;
 - 10.1.2 by the NEC, AGM or Council.
- The Chairperson shall convene an SGM within forty (40) days of receipt of such request.
- 10.3 The notice of an SGM shall contain the nature and grounds of the reason for the meeting.
- 10.4 A copy of such notice shall be forwarded to each Member, by the Secretary General, at least thirty (30) days prior to the date of the meeting.

ARTICLE 11: QUORUMS

For all meetings the quorum shall be fifty percent plus one (50% + 1) of all possible votes.

ARTICLE 12: VOTING

Only Members in good standing with USSA, including paid up affiliation and staff fees may participate in the voting process. The staff or student member attending the meeting may submit a written proxy on behalf of the person not attending. Such written proxy must be submitted with the letters of credence or prior to commencement of the meeting (as per clause 8.5.4). At least one delegate must attend the meeting in person.

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- Constituent members shall be accorded votes according to their enrolment numbers. Constituent members shall be accorded votes in the following manner:
 - 12.2.1 Universities with more than 25 000 students: 3 votes;
 - 12.2.2 Universities with more than 10 000 students: 2 votes;
 - 12.2.3 Universities with less than 10 000 students: 1 vote.
- Each fully represented Member (institution) and each National University Sport Association to the Council shall have one (1) vote. However, only fully represented Member Institutions of Higher Education may participate and vote in the election process for the NEC.
- Each member of the NEC shall have one (1) vote at all meetings of the Executive Committee.
- At all meetings, the Chairperson of the meeting shall have a casting vote, except during elections of the NEC and constitutional amendments. However, the Chairperson shall have a casting vote in Council, such a vote representing the decision of the NEC on the specific matter under discussion.
- The Chairperson shall propose, for the approval of the meeting, an electoral officer and at least three (3) scrutineers for all voting.
- Voting at all USSA meetings may employ one of the following methods as approved by the meeting by:
 - 12.7.1 A show of hands; or
 - 12.7.2 secret ballot.
- 12.8 The election of office bearers in the NEC shall be by secret ballot.

ARTICLE 13: <u>RULES AND REGULATIONS</u>

- 13.1 In addition to the provisions of this Constitution, the NEC shall issue such rules and regulations as may be approved by the Council and/or AGM for the smooth running of the affairs of USSA.
- Such rules and regulations shall be amended by the Council for ratification by the AGM.
- 13.3 Any amendment of the rules and regulations shall be entered in the minutes of the particular Council meeting at which such amendments have been passed. If the minutes have been duly circulated, as provided for in the Constitution, this shall be deemed sufficient notice of such amendments.

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ARTICLE 14: SUBSCRIPTIONS

The Council shall before the end of October of each year, determine subscriptions payable by Members and such other fees and levies as deemed necessary.

ARTICLE 15: FINANCE

- 15.1 The NEC, as authorised by the Council, shall open and operate a banking account with a registered banking institution in South Africa in accordance with the financial regulations approved by Council.
- There shall be two (2) signatories to every cheque or instrument drawn on the banking account, one of whom shall be the Treasurer and/or the Secretary General and any other official delegated by the NEC.
- 15.3 The Treasurer, with the help of the Secretary General/Chief Executive Officer shall submit an annual auditor's report as well as an audited financial statement to the AGM.
- 15.4 The financial year of USSA shall commence on the first day of January and end on the last day of December of each calendar year.
- 15.5 Affiliation fees shall be payable by the thirty-first day of March of each year.
- 15.6 The Secretary General/Chief Executive Officer shall keep proper books of account, which books shall record all financial transactions by USSA, and such books of account shall be reconciled regularly with the banking account of USSA.
- 15.7 The auditors shall be appointed by the NEC for ratification by the AGM.

ARTICLE 16: DISCIPLINE

Any Member or Individual who, contravenes any of the terms or provisions of this Constitution, or fails or refuses to implement any lawful decision of the Council, the NEC, or any standing committee of USSA, shall be charged with misconduct as provided for in the rules and regulations of the Council.

ARTICLE 17: ANTI DOPING

USSA shall recognise the Regulations of Drug-Free Sport South Africa, FISU and the World Anti Doping Code. USSA shall make appropriate Anti-Doping Regulations, governing the use of drugs and imposing prescribed sanctions where a doping offence shall have found to have been committed. In terms of the said Regulations of FISU and the World Anti Doping Agency, USSA shall implement and apply the said Regulations save to the extent that the said Regulations need to be varied to take into account the requirements of governmental legislation and the national drug testing authorities and/or as otherwise provided for in the said Regulations of FISU.

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ARTICLE 18: DISPUTE RESOLUTION

- Any disagreement relating to the enforceability of this Constitution or of the interpretation or application of the provisions thereof, or any conflict of interest between any number of members of USSA or between a member and USSA itself, shall be deemed to be a dispute, and such dispute shall be dealt with in terms of the rules and regulations issued by the Council.
- Any dispute arising carried forward from the above, or any dispute between any Member of the NEC and USSA itself, shall be referred to the Arbitration Federation of Southern Africa (AFSA) for resolution through mediation or expedited arbitration in terms of the Rules and Procedures for the Resolution of Disputes in Sport, prevailing at the time such dispute is so referred. In the event of arbitration in terms of the afore-going, such resolution shall be final and binding on the parties in the dispute.

ARTICLE 19: AMENDMENT OF THE CONSTITUTION

- This constitution may be amended at the AGM. Recommendations for amendments may be submitted by any member or the NEC and does not require a seconder on submission. Recommendations for amendments must be forwarded to the secretary 20 days prior to the AGM (refer article 9).
- 19.2 This constitution may also be amended at an SGM of USSA called specifically for that purpose upon written request of at least 40% of the members of USSA.
- The said amendments shall be passed by a majority of two thirds $(^2/_3)$ of those present and entitled to vote at such meeting.
- 19.4 The Rules and Regulations will be updated to include all consequential changes brought about by amendments to the constitution.
- 19.5 Any constitutional changes are immediately applicable upon adoption by the AGM, SGM or Council.

ARTICLE 20: DISSOLUTION

- 20.1 USSA shall be dissolved upon a resolution passed by a majority of two thirds of the Members at an SGM called specifically for that purpose.
- Upon dissolution and after the satisfaction of all its debts and liabilities, any property whatsoever in the possession of USSA shall by a resolution of the General Meeting of members, be given or transferred to another non-profit organisation that has similar objectives.
